

United Society for Christian Literature Archives, 1799-1960

Introduction

The United Society for Christian Literature was created in 1935 by the merger of the Religious Tract Society and the Christian Literature Society for India and Africa. It was joined in 1941/1942 by the London and Scottish committees of the Christian Literature Society for China.

Religious Tract Society

The Religious Tract Society is by far the oldest of the constituent groups of the USCL. It was founded in 1799 by a group of Protestant evangelicals who had earlier founded the London Missionary Society and were later to form the British and Foreign Bible Society.

The goal of the RTS was to print and distribute religious tracts among people with little leisure time for reading lengthy volumes. It was the group's hope that these tracts would lead people to a knowledge of salvation through Jesus Christ. It was an interdenominational effort.

The Society did its work in Britain, the British colonies and on the continent of Europe. By 1848 the RTS was operating either directly or indirectly in China, Singapore, Borneo, Thailand, Burma, India, Sri Lanka, Australia and New Zealand, the South Pacific, Africa, Madagascar, the West Indies, the United States, Canada, most European countries, and the countries of the Near and Middle East.

Christian Literature Society for India

This society was formally created in 1858 as a memorial to the Indian Mutiny by four British missionary societies working in India, including the London Missionary Society and the Wesleyan Methodist Missionary Society. The Society's goal was to reach the masses in the villages and at the local level through the use of the vernacular in the pamphlets it printed and distributed. In 1923 the Society expanded its activities to Africa.

Christian Literature Society for China

This society was first founded in 1877 with the goal of diffusing Christian and general knowledge among the Chinese.
