Remarks .- 1. Additional Vowel-sounds.

The sign • placed over the Syllabics in second column is used to express the vowel i, as in the word thine; e.g., $i \stackrel{?}{\circ}$, $pi \stackrel{?}{\circ}$, $ti \stackrel{?}{\circ}$, &c. A dot placed over the characters in third column lengthens the vowel-sound to as as in the word $aaad : e.g. no \stackrel{?}{\circ} no \stackrel{?}{\circ} too \stackrel{?}{\circ}$. &c. Dotted characters in the fourth division are sound as a, as in the word far; e.g., $a \stackrel{?}{\circ}$, $pa \stackrel{?}{\circ}$, $ta \stackrel{?}{\circ}$, &c.

2. DOUBLE CONSONANTS.

The nasal sound (almost expressed by our letters n is formed by the character b, while the guttural sour rk (almost ark) is expressed by two small fin characters b.
