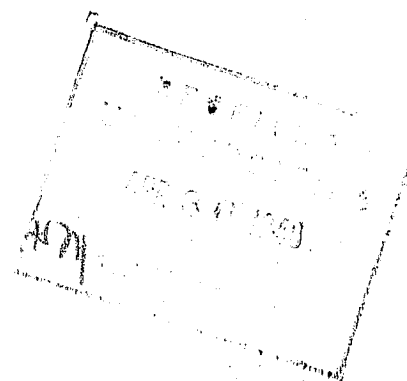





Dear Dr. Parker:

First of all I wish to thank you again with all the sincerity that comes only from a grateful heart for your kindness to me in the past. I am reminded constantly of your help in securing the scholarship for me for this current school year. It has helped me out so very much in carrying on the research studies here. It has meant not only financial help but encouragement to continue the work as well. Thank you very much, indeed.

As time goes by quickly, I fear another school year will soon be here. My work for the higher degree shall need one more year's time. Few were able to escape the influenza epidemic last winter in this part of the country. It has hindered my work somewhat. I am now writing you, Dr. Parker, if you would do me the favor again by presenting my request to the Scholarship Committee for another year's grant, between \$500 to \$300, whatever amount the Committee feel able to allocate for such purposes.

In regard to my standing, may I say that I had previously worked in a Christian College for more than ten years, before I came again to this country for graduate work this time. Dear Miss Wong:

Your letter of March 31 has just reached us, and I am somewhat concerned to know that you are seeking assistance for another year. It had been our impression here that you were expecting to complete your work during this school year. Until this letter came to us, we had no indication that you would be asking for assistance this coming year. Our instructions to the presidents of the colleges regarding scholarships is that all requests must be in our hands by the first of November, preceding the year in which the grant is to be used. Our scholarship committee met early in January to consider the applications which had been received and at that time all money available for next year was allocated. It is, of course, too late to make any change in these allocations since the people to whom they have been given have been notified and have made their plans accordingly. I do not know of any source to which we could turn for additional funds.

I am very sorry, indeed, to have to reply to you in this way, but I do not, at the present time, see any way in which we can help you for the school year of 1941-42.
