OPENING OF MEETING

The Chairman. Dr. Frank T. Cartwright opened the meeting with prayer.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

The minutes of previous meetings were considered and it was

F - 1 VOTED to approve the following minutes as circulated:-Annual Meeting Board of Trustees, May 11, 1945 Record of Circulation Vote Executive Committee, Board of Trustees, August 30, 1945 Soint Meeting, Fukien and Hwa Nan Committees. October 25, 1946.

REPORTS AND COMMUNICATIONS FROM CHINA

The Committee took note of the following documents which had previously been circulated;-

1) Minutes of Board of Managers, Dec. 13, 1945, Jan. 2, 1946

2) President's Report on conditions. Fall Term 1945.

The Committee considered carefully the three following documents which were distributed with the dockets-

1) Committee Report on Administrative Coordination of Fukien Christian University, Hwa Nan College and Fukien Union Theological College.

Report of Committee on Academic Relations of Fukien Christian University, Awa Nan College and Union Theological College.

3) Report of Committee on Location of Adjacent Campuses, Fukien Christian University. Hwa Nan College and Tukien Union Theological College.

Dean T. H. Cheng reported that a letter just received from China told of plans for reopening the University on May 1st, spending a month finishing up the interrupted fall semester and then beginning the spring semester, continuing through the summer without the usual vacation.

Dr. Cartwright then gave a statement on his visit to Foochow, describing the state of the campus and buildings, and explaining the causes of the student strike of the previous November with its effects on faculty and student merale. He also told in detail of the progress of negotiations between Fukien Christian University, Hwa Nan College and Fukien Union Theological College which led to the agreement on administrative coordination and location on adjacent campuses.

MATTERS GROWING OUT OF MEETING OF ASSOCIATED BOARDS

Report of the Planning Committee

The Committee took note that the Planning Committee of the Associated Boards had included in its report the following paragraphs in regard to Fukien Christian University:

Nulcien Province. The Planning Committee greets with satisfaction the plans of Fukien Christian University, Hwa Nan College and the Fukien Union Theological College which are proceeding in accordance with the recommendations made by this Committee in 1945, namely, that in or near the city of Foochow the institutions concerned coordinate their facilities and programs at a single educational center.

It is understood that steps have been taken through the appointment of a Joint Administrative Council to effect the highest measure of coordination, eliminating duplication and making the largest possible use of common facilities.

The Committee, while recording its interest in the plans projected by the Board of Managers of Fukien Christian University on March 8, 1945, must point out that — in viewing the over-all needs of China in higher education — it can, with the funds hoped for in the immediate future, recommend the support of only a limited program of university education of the highest level in Fakien Frovince. Specifically, as explained elsewhere, the Committee finds itself unable to recommend the initiation of any new colleges or departments. The Committee recommends for Fukien Christian University a College of Arts, a College of Science and a College of Rural Reconstruction.

After discussing these recommendations in the light of the statement made by Dr. Cartwright, it was

that the Fukien Christian University Committee has heard with satisfaction the report of Dr. Frank T. Cartwright on the progress made in Foochow in plans for collaboration between Fukien Christian University and Hwa Nan College, with the inclusion of the Fukien Union Theological College; believes these plans to be in accord with the recommendations of the Flanning Committee of the Associated Boards which it approves expresses its hope that these plans will be developed in detail as rapidly as possible, care being taken to conserve the distinctive values of each institution concerned, and recommends them to the Associated Boards' Committee on Promotion for presentation to the American constituency.

Leave of Absence for President C. J. Lin

The Committee had before it a radiogram from Bishop Carleton Lacy advising that arrangements be made for President Lin and his wife to go abroad for a furlough without delay. After consideration of this message, it was

F - 3 VOTED that, recognizing the high value of the services of President C. J.

Lin to Fukien Christian University, and looking forward to the future service he can render to the University, this Committee approves granting him a year's leave of absence, trusting that he will so time his departure as to make sure that there will be a competent acting president in charge before he leaves.

College of Rural Reconstruction

As the idea of a College of Rural Reconstruction, such as has been recommended for Fukien Christian University by the Planning Committee is new, and different conceptions are current as to what it involves, it was

F - 4 VOTED that a sub-committee be appointed to study the possibilities of a college of rural reconstruction. In cooperation with a similar sub-committee of the Shantung Christian University Committee, and to prepare a statement to be sent to Foochow.

The Chairman appointed Dr. Winfield, Dean Cheng. Dr. Stowe and Dr. Yang.

Promotion

Dr. Winfield spoke of the plans of the Committee on Promotion and noted that in Focchow there already is a committee appointed to send the kind of information that will be needed here in presenting projects to prospective donors.

FINANCIAL MATTERS

Current Administrative Budget

The Associate Treasurer, Mr. Evans, stated that he anticipated that there would be a slight deficit in the current administrative budget but he suggested

that by using credits in the Endowment Stabilization Fund or miscellaneous gifts for current needs, this deficit could be covered. It was

F - 5 VOTED to authorize the Treasurer to transfer an amount sufficient to balance the administrative budget for the year ending June 30, 1946, either from credits in the Endowment Stabilization Fund or from miscellaneous gifts for current needs,

Budget for Next Year

A schedule was presented by the Associate Treasurer showing income that it was anticipated would be available to the United Board for the benefit of Fukien Christian University during 1946-47, and proposed expenditures. (See APPENDIX - A). This was considered and it was

r - 6 VOTED to accept the schedule presented by the Associate Treasurer showing anticipated income of the United Board for the benefit of Fukien Christian University and proposed expenditures and to recommend it to the United Board for adoption.

Report of the Treasurer for 1944-45

The Report of the Treasurer of the Board of Trustees of Fukien Christian University for the year ending June 30, 1945, having already been presented to the Committee on Investment and Finance of the United Board, was brought before the Fukien Christian University Committee for the information of members and for action upon the recommendations contained in the report. It was

F - 7 VOTED to approve the recommendations contained in the Report of the Treasurer of the Board of Trustees of Fukien Christian University for the year ending June 30, 1945, namely:

"Recommendation #1. That the 1944-45 Current Surplus of \$43.52 be applied to the 1941-42 deficit reducing same to \$1.396.81

"Recommendation #2. That the balance of \$1.396.81 in Miscellaneous Gifts for Current Needs be applied to the 1941-42 deficit, thus balancing the account."

A copy of the Report is appended to these minutes as APPENDIX - B.

Report of the Auditors

The Associate Treasurer stated that the report of the Auditors, Messra Chambellan, Berger and Welti for 1944-45 had been received by the Committee of Investment and Finance of the United Board and passed on to the Fukien Christain University Committee for its information. Copies of this report were circulated among members and it was

F - 5 VOTED to accept the report of the Auditors, Messrs Chambellan, Berger and Welti for the year ending June 30, 1945 and to place it on file,

Schedule for reimbursing Western Staff for War Damages

It was reported that a study had been made of the policies of several Mission Boards in the matter of reimbursing western personnel for losses due to the war and that as a result, the Trustees of the United Board had recommended a schedule on an approximately similar basis for reimbursement of western faculty not appointed by Mission Boards. This schedule was adopted by the Fukien Christian University Committee except that the suggested limitation of reimbursement to a "maximum of five children to a family" was omitted. It was accordingly

- F 9 VOTED to adopt the following schedule for reimbursing western staff, not appointed by Mission Boards, for losses due to war, namely:-
 - 1. Up to \$500 for each adult.
 - 2. Up to \$100 for each child.

REMARKS BY BISHOP WARD

Bishop Ralph Ward arrived near the close of the meeting and was introduced to the Committee. He spoke briefly of the great value of Dr. Cartwright's visit to China last fall and winter. He also told of his growing sense of the necessity of taking into consideration in all our planning the attitude and convictions of our substantial Chinese colleagues. He pointed to some very vital lines of growth,

APPOINTMENT OF COMMITTEES

Note was taken of the fact that the Trustees of the United Board had authorized "the respective College and University Committees each to appoint an Interim Committee of five to seven members to act for it in matters appropriate for them so to act, subject to such regulations as the individual College and University Committees may prescribe. It was accordingly

F - 10 VOTED to request and authorize the Chairman to appoint an Interim Committee of from five to seven members.

The Committee on Nominations and Administration of the United Board having left to the individual College and University Committees the naming of their representatives on the Standing Committees of the Associated Boards, it was

F - 11 VOTED to appoint the following persons to represent the Fukien Christian University Committee on the Standing Committees of the Associated Boards:-

REPORT OF THE TREASURER

to the

FUKIEN CHRISTIAN UNIVERSITY COMMITTEE

FOR THE YEAR ENDING JUNE 30, 1946

The year 1945-46 saw the end of the Japanese war in China and the return of Fukien Christian University to its campus at Foochow. An epidemic of plague hastened the removal and the hurried repairs to the property at Foochow. Limited building restoration was wisely done at limited expense while only temporary rehabilitation of the grounds was attempted.

With full communications opened up with Foothow some long-lost correspondence came to light and new pictures revealed of conditions in Fukien Province.

In America the activities of the Fukien Committee were centered in the organization of the United Board for Christian Colleges in China and the efforts of the Associated Boards to secure funds to sustain the work of the College. Actually the teaching task at Foochow was taken up with greatly increased enrollment.

This report is accompanied by the following papers:

The auditors, Messrs. Chambellan, Berger and Welti have checked the figures in this report.

ENDOWNENT

There was an increase of \$1,710.13 in Endowment Funds during the year, -

Income on Stabilization Fund

The foregoing figure was shown in Assets through increased cash awaiting investment.

Investments yielded income of \$6,506.48 during the year or 3.96% of principle at beginning of year plus cash on hand.

Agreeable to action taken by the United Board, the Fukien Endowment Investments and cash were consolidated on June 30, 1946 with those of other universities in the United Board. The market value of that date was used and showed an appreciation of \$12,296.59 which showed up on the books after the close of the year.

PLANT

An increase of \$1,129.80 was shown in the Plant Section during the year and is accounted for as follows:

This increased the Plant cash by \$948.25 and Savings Bank deposits by \$181.55.

No adjustments have been made for many years in the "Land Improvements" and Building Operations" to correspond with annual expenditures in China. This was due primarily to lack of exact information from China in the early days covering interchange of funds, and latterly to the exchange situation. In view of what has happened to the physical plant during war years, all thought of reconcilement should be totally abandoned.

CURRENT SECTION

Funds ander this heading treat largely of Budgetary items and both receipts and disbursements are shown in the Budget Analysis, Page 5.

It will be noted that the difference between Receipts (Class A) of \$13,557.86 and Disbursements of \$11,823.13 is \$1,734.73. This surplus may be accounted for as follows:

All of income under Class B "Special Funds" was made available for the field on June 30 and credited to "Accounts Payable."

Under agreement with the Associated Boards certain funds received from United Service to China (formerly United China Relief) were transmitted to the field in Chinese currency. This totaled CN\$38,425,259.92 or US\$34,785.53 at the prevailing rate of exchange.

CURRENT SPECIAL

Under this section certain non-budgetary items are carried, some of which call for special mention.

Directors' Current Fund Investments. Investment of Directors' Funds has remained unchanged during the year except for the accumulation of interest in the Savings Bank Account. The situation is as follows:

Margaret Sutton Memorial. This fund increased by \$85,00 during the year te a total of \$389.90.

Miscellaneous Gifts for Current Budget. A balance of \$1,188.50 was carried forward in this account as of July I, 1946 and recommendations are made elsewhere covering this amount.

Scholarship and Student Aid. Income beyond budgeted amounts brought the total in this fund to \$274.32 on June 30, 1946.

Rehabilitation Funds. The balance in this fund June 30 was \$39,307.71 made up from the following sources;

REPORT OF THE TREASURER

BOARD OF TRUSTEES, FUKIEN CHRISTIAN UNIVERSITY

FOR THE YEAR ENDING JUNE 30, 1945

Fukien Christian University continued to carry on its work at Shaowu although it suffered greatly from the loss of Foreign Staff and the ramifications of inflation. Communication with the University Administration was largely halted during the year and only a few cables and letters got through. Thus the constituency in the United States has not been as well informed as in the past.

Money raising program in the United States was largely centered in the efforts of the Associated Boards, to secure sufficient relief funds from United China Relief to keep the work going in China. Later comments in this report will indicate that the local currency dollars secured probably cared for the 1944-45 needs.

ENDOWMENT

The total Endowment Funds increased by \$113.39 during the year to a new figure of \$168,787.04. This increase came entirely from income on the Endowment Income Stabilization Fund.

There was an increase of Mission Board support as shown in the Budget Analysis (Page 8). The American Board also paid \$1,115.00 for vacancies on staff. There was also an increase in Endowment Income. The decrease in Sustaining Funds was due to the larger rate of exchange secured through the operation of the United Clearing Board. The Local Currency equivalent of Sustaining Funds actually sent to China was L.C.\$12,541,175.92, a truly inflated amount in comparison to previous years. Due to the death of Mr. John G. OPENING OF MEETING

The meeting was called to order by the Chairman, Dr. Cartwright. opening prayer was offered by the Reverend W. Galloway Tyson.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

The minutes of the previous meeting were considered and it was

F-12 VOTED to approve as circulated the minutes of the Annual Meeting held on May 16, 1946.

MEMORIAL MINUTES

The Committee expressed its sense of loss in the death of Dr. C. J. Lin, President of the University and of Mr. Fred Sites, a member of the Committee. Prof. Everett Stowe was requested to prepare a memorial minute on the late President C. J. Lin and the Chairman was asked to prepare a memorial minute on Mr. Fred Sites. (See Appendix A) The Committee took note of the receipt of a copy of a resolution on President Lin, adopted by the Board of Fereign Missions of the Reformed Church in America.

REPORTS AND COMMUNICATIONS FROM CHINA

There was a general pooling of information about the University by Dr. Shafer, Dr. McMullen, Dr. Ding and Mr. Lacy and others.

In the course of the discussion a question was asked as to whether the constitution adopted in China for correlating the three institutions in Foochow, needed ratification by this Committee and the United Board.

Dr. Cartwright expressed the opinion that such ratification was not necessary because the Boards of Directors in China had full authority to adopt such a constitution and besides they were acting in accord with the recommendations of the Planning Committee of the Associated Boards.

Dr. Shafer said, however, that as a matter of principle, where three institutions decide to correlate their activities, the condition for the proposed correlation should be considered by the Mission Boards concerned, for the purpose of determining the extent of their support.

LIBRARY MATTERS

Dr. McMullen reported a gift of \$5,000 from the "Riverside Fund for World Service" of the Riverside Church, New York, for the rehabilitation of the library of Fukien Christian University as a memorial to the late Dr. C. J. Lin.

It was also reported that the Men's Class of the Riverside Church is proposing to collect books for the libraries of the China Colleges.

It was

F-13 VOTED that the Secretary be asked to send a letter of thanks to the "Riverside Fund for World Service" of the Riverside Church, New York, expressing gratitude for the gift of \$5,000 for the library of Fukien Christian University.

Other aspects of the library situation were brought out. It was stated that only 5,000 of the books taken to Shaowu had been lost. This was due to the overturning of one boat.

Dr. McMullen told of the plan to send Dr. Charles B. Shaw, librarian of Swarthmore College to China in the fall, to visit the Christian Colleges, study their libraries and make recommendations for their development. He is commissioned also to select five or six librarians to come to the United States for further study. The budget for these projects has been underwritten by the Harvard Yenching Institute.

Prof. Goodrich expressed his judgment that it is important to provide further training for Mr. Chin Yung-ming, librarian of Fukien. At the close of this discussion, it was

F-14 VOTED that, in the judgment of the Fukien Christian University Committee, the continued cultivation of the University library is of great importance.

FINANCIAL MATTERS

Proposed Budget for 1947-48

Dr. McMullen said that the Associated Boards had a sked the Mission Boards to double their cash grants to the Colleges and also to bring their faculty personnel up to the original level.

Dr. Shafer said that the Reformed Board had appointed a new man to the faculty -- Mr. Gordon J. Van Wyk -- and so could not double its cash grant, especially as it had already doubled its previous grant of \$500.

Mr. Evans then presented the proposed budget for 1947-48 (See Appendix B). He explained that the item "Home administration - Executive office \$6,500" was a tentative figure which might have to be revised. After due consideration it was

F-15 VOTED to approve the proposed budget for 1947-48 and to refer it to the United Board.

Report of the Auditors

The report of the auditors, Messrs. Chambellan, Berger and Welti for the year ending June 30, 1946 was presented and after examination it was

F- 16 VOTED to a ccept the report of the auditors, Messrs. Chambellan, Berger and Welti for the year ending June 30, 1946 and to express appreciation for the work of the treasurers.

Consideration of Case of Mrs. C. J. Lin

Consideration was given to the question as to what further provision should be made for Mrs. C. J. Lin. It was explained that Mrs. Lin's daughter had a four-year scholarship at Allegheny College with camp work in the summer.

Mrs. Lin's son is now attending the Collegiate School in New York. When he is ready, he will be helped through Fukien Christian University by the University itself. Mrs. Lin has been getting a refresher course in her medical profession by working at Mt. Sinai Hospital four days a week. She feels the need for an additional period of study before returning to China.

Mr. Lacy said that the managers fully expect to take the family back to China.

After further discussion it was

F-17 VOTED to appropriate \$500 toward the expenses of Mrs. C. J. Lin and to plan to pay the travel expenses of the family back to China.

Report of Treasurer for the Year Ending June 30, 1946

The report of the treasurer for the year ending June 30, 1946 was considered and it was

- F-18 VOTED to receive the report of the treasurer for the year ending June 30, 1946, to approve and present for a doption by the United Board the following recommendations:
 - 1) That the sum of \$259.00 in current surplus received from Mission Boards be credited to Accounts Payable for the use of the field.
 - 2) That the balance of \$1,475.73 in current surplus be carried forward as a credit on the Home Administration charge for 1946-47.
 - 3) That the sum of \$1,188.50 from "Gifts for Current Needs" not being required to balance the budget be credited to (111 d) Endowment Income Stabilization Fund.

Status of Budget for 1946-47

The status of the current budget for 1946-47 was discussed by Mr. Evans who stated that he expected there would be a deficit at the end of June, 1947 and recommended that this be met by a transfer of the amount that may be needed from the Endowment Income Stahilization Fund.

It was accordingly

F-19 VOTED that if there is a deficit in the current budget at the end of the current fiscal year, said deficit be met by a transfer from the Endowment Income Stabilization fund, of the amount needed to balance the budget.

Expenses of Mr. Henry Lacy

It was explained to the Committee that Mrs. Leon Roy Peel had called attention to the desirability of having Mr. Henry Lacy attend the meetings of the Associated Boards in view of his being controller both of Fukien Christian University and Hwa Nan College. A large portion of Mr. Lacy's travel is covered by a pass secured by the Methodist Board. Mrs. Peel had offered to ask Hwa Nan College to assume half of the remaining part of Mr. Lacy's expenses if the Fukien Committee would assume the other half. It was

F-20 VOTED that the Fukien Christian University Committee assume one-half of the balance of the travel expenses of Mr. Henry Lacy to attend the Annual Meeting of the Associated Boards.

APPOINTMENT OF COMMITTEES

Dr. Goodrich was elected to the Interim Committee to fill the vacancy created by the death of Mr. Sites.

OTHER BUSINESS

The Committee discussed at some length the reasons for Dr. Theodore Chen's refusal to accept the presidency of Fukien Christian University. Dr. Warner volunteered to write to him expressing his own views of the matter. No official action was taken by the Committee.

ADJOUR NIVENT

The Committee having completed its business, adjourned.

In Memoriam - President C. J. Lin

The life of President C. J. Lin bodied forth in unforgettable ways the meaning of a phrase he himself often used in description of the aims of Christian education: love, service and sacrifice.

The years in which he held office, and the office of the presidency itself, tested to the full each of these attributes. He took up the presidency in 1927 in the midst of a domestic revolution. His last years were the increasingly difficult ones of the eight years' war with Japan. Throughout this long period it became ever more true that Fukien Christian University was the "lengthened shadow of a man".

President Lin devoted himself in complete integrity and loyalty to his university, to the cause of democracy in China and the world, and to his vision of the Christian way. To the endless administrative and educational problems of the university he brought equally endless patience, self-control, and courage. To the interpretation of democracy, in convocation gatherings and class-room, he joined his deep knowledge of the Chinese heritage with long study of the political and social institutions of the West. And for the perplexing riddles of the life of this period of history, he maintained the quiet assurance that came from a profound religious conviction, centered in the personality and teachings of Christ.

His death brought to all who had been privileged to be a member of the faculty under his leadership a great sense of loss and bereavement. But to all service and sacrifice.

In Memoriam - Mr. Frederick Robert Sites

The Fukien Christian University Committee has learned with sorrow of the death on April 29th, 1947 of Frederick Robert Sites, long-time friend of the University. He was born in China, the son of Nathan and Sarah Moore Sites who were pioneers of the Methodist Church in Fukien Province.

From 1912 until 1945, when he retired, he was connected with the United States Steel Corporation. For several years he was stationed in China. After his return to America he became secretary to Judge Elbert H. Gary, chairman of the board.

Because of his vital interest in Christian education in Fukien he was elected a member of the Board of Founders of Fukien Christian University in 1936 and he was a faithful, wise member of that body until his death at the age of 68.

The Fukien Committee and the University itself have suffered a serious loss in his death, and the Committee personally and also on behalf of the entire cause of Christian higher education in China express sympathy to Mrs. Sites and other surviving members of the family.

The meeting was called to order by the Chairman, Dr. Frank T. Cartwright and Dr. Harold S. Matthews offered the opening prayer.

ROLL CALL AND REGRETS FOR NON-ATTENDANCE

Excuses for absence were presented on behalf of Dr. Lewis Hodous, Rev. W. Galloway Tyson and Miss Sue Weddell.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

The Minutes of the Annual Meeting of May 13, 1947 were approved.

REPORTS AND COMMUNICATIONS FROM CHINA

The following documents had been circulated with the docket and were the basis of the discussion under this heading: A letter from Dr. C. T. Yang to Dr. R. J. McMullen, Minutes of the Board of Managers of Fukien of March 3rd and March 10th, and revised By-Laws for the Christian Colleges of Fukien.

Student Enrollment

The Committee took note of the fact that there were 590 students enrolled of whom 488 were men and 102 were women. The student enrollment is 10% less than last year and 17% less than two years ago.

Faculty Salaries

It was also noted that though faculty salaries avaraged US\$47.70 a month during the first semester of 1947-48 as compared with US\$48.00 in 1937 the purchasing power was only 32 1/3%.

Student Morale

There was careful consideration of the conditions which produced the student strike in January. Dr. McMullen reported that the spirit was now very much better.

Status of Proposed Cooperation with Hwa Nen and Union Theological College

Attention was called to the fact that the By-Laws of the Christian Colleges of Fukien had been revised by the Board of Managers of Fukien Christian University but that this amended version had not yet been accepted by Hwa Nan or the Union Theological College. Dr. Fenn explained the misunderstanding that had arisen through the continued admission of women to Fukien Christian University. He said that Hwa Nan regarded this as a breach of the agreement, whereas Fukien felt it necessary to continue to admit women until such time as definite plans for implementing the proposed cooperation were formulated. The Committee felt that these were issues which must be worked out in China.

Welcome to Shantung

The Committee took notice of the action of the Board of Managers offering a welcome to the Cheeloo Medical College if it came to Foochow and listing the possible buildings that would be available. It was reported that the Shantung Christian University Committee of the United Board had met the previous evening and had decided to recommend that

- 1. that the United Board favor the moving of the Cheeloo College of Medicine immediately after the close of the present school year, accepting the invitation from Foochow, and thus conserving equipment and staff.
- 2. that in case it becomes impossible for the College of Arts and the College of Science to continue to function in Tsinan that the United Board favor suspending these colleges and arranging for the temporary placement of students and faculty in other institutions.

After discussion it was

F-21 VOTED cordially to endorse the invitation issued by the Board of Managers of Fukien Christian University to the Cheeloo College of Medicine to move to Foochow

FINANCIAL MATTERS

Status of the Current Budget

The Associate Treasurer stated that there would probably be a surplus of \$700 on the current budget.

F-24 VOTED to accept the budget presented by the Associate Treasurer showing anticipated income of the United Board for the benefit of Fukien Christian University for 1948-49 and proposed expenditures and to recommend it to the United Board for adoption.

Progress of Rehabilitation

It was stated that the University had received to date \$151,130.39 from Restoration Funds from various sources. This includes funds for returning from Shaowu to Foochow, for reoutfitting Chinese personnel, for the purchase of blankets and beds and for repairs and equipment.

PERSO NNEL

Western Faculty Members

A list of American faculty members was considered. It was stated that Miss Leona Burr is on furlough and will not be going back to China. The University has asked that a science family be sent to fill the place of Miss Burr and the American Board is seeking to fulfill this request.

Chinese Faculty Members Studying Abroad

It was stated that last year the University had only one member of its Chinese faculty studying abroad but will have three more during the coming year, the United

Board having awarded two general fellowships and one library fellowship to candidates recommended by the University.

Status of the Presidency

Many favorable comments were made upon the way Dr. C. T. Yang has carried his heavy responsibilities during the past year as President of the University. In spite of opposition from some of the students it was felt that he has gradually won his way and is in a much stronger position than he was a few months ago.

REPORT OF THE TREASURER

TO THE

FUKIEN CHRISTIAN UNIVERSITY COMMITTEE

FOR THE YEAR ENDING JUNE 30, 1947

The fiscal year of 1946-47 witnessed a real catastrophe for Fukien in the death of President C. J. Lin in New York on January 6, 1947. Dr. Theodore Chen from the University of Southern California had agreed to go to China and substituted for Dr. Lin for one year but felt he could not stay longer, though urged to do so. The directors then turned to Dr. C. T. Yang of the Union Theological Seminary at Foochow, and he agreed to act as President for at least a year.

Work was carried on during the year with a minimum of difficulty and repairs to buildings and campus continued.

Activities in America. were carried on principally through the Associated Boards which became the United Board on July 1, 1947 and took over all Assets and Liabilities as well as all operations. Funds to carry on during the year in addition to the regular budget were secured through United Service to China and an increased rate of exchange enabled less U.S. dollars to suffice.

OPENING OF MEETING

The meeting was called to order by the Chairman, Dr. Cartwright. The opening prayer was offered by Dr. Shafer.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

The minutes of the Annual Meeting held on May 11, 1948 were approved as circulated.

REPORTS AND COMMUNICATIONS FROM CHINA

It was reported that the fall term had opened with an enrollment of 574, of whom 208 were in Arts, 150 in Science and 216 in Agriculture. It was explained that the large enrollment in Agricultural Economics—130 students—is due to the fact that many want business training and so take the courses in Economics in the College of Agriculture because there are no courses in Economics in the other Colleges of the University.

It was noted that the Cheeloo College of Medicine had moved to Foochow, but the offer of Fukien Christian University to take in the Cheeloo pre-medical students had not been accepted. These students had gone to Hangchow instead.

Other matters contained in the reports were discussed later in the meeting.

PROMOTIONAL MATTERS

Dr. Winfield explained the plans for the United Board campaign for \$50%,000 which had been launched on November 4, and was already beginning to bring in returns. He emphasized the necessity of finding new givers and asked for the cooperation of members

of the Fukien Christian University Committee. The need for achieving the goal of \$500,000 was emphasized on view of the difficulties all the Universities were experiencing due to the new gold ylan currency, and the attempt of the Government to hold the exchange rate at GY\$4.00 to US\$1.00. It was agreed that a message of encouragement should be sent to cheer the administration, and it was

F-26 VOTED to send a letter to Fukien Christian University expressing the Committee's sympathy with the administrative officers in regard to the financial and other difficulties they face, and pledging the Committee to do all it can to help meet the situation.

Dr. McMullen and Dr. Shafer, in consultation with the Chairman, were asked to formulate the message.

FINANCIAL MATTERS

Mr. Evans, presented an audited report of the Treasurer for the year ending June 30, 1948. He pointed out that there had been a saving of \$875.07 in the cost of Home Administration and suggested that this amount be credited to the Reserve Fund Account Number 176. It was

F-27 VOTED to receive the report of the Treasurer for Fukien Christian University for the year ending June 30, 1948 and to adopt the recommendation that the surplus of \$875.07 be credited to the Reserve Fund Account Number 176 and to transmit the report to the United Board for inspection by the appropriate committee.

The report of the Auditors, Messrs. Chambellan, Berger and Welti, for the year ending June 30, 1948 was presented to the Committee. It was noted that the report embodied no recommendations. It was then

F-28 VOTED to receive the report of the auditors for the accounts of Fukien Christian University for the year ending June 30, 1948 and to transmit it to the United Board for inspection by the appropriate committee.

THE COLLEGE OF AGRICULTURE

There was a discussion as to whether Fukien Christian University should be encouraged to continue to operate a College of Agriculture or to transform it into a College of Rural Life. It was recalled that the Planning Committee of the Associated Boards stated its conviction that not more than one front rank college of agriculture can, at present, be maintained by the Christian missions in China and, therefore, that it was unwise for institutions other than the University of Nanking to attempt to maintain anything so ambitious as a College of Agriculture. On the other side of the question the view was expressed that the agricultural work at Fukien has been unusually successful in manifesting the Christian spirit and than actual contact with farm operations may be a more effective type of education that theoretical discussions about rural life. At the close of the discussion it was

F-29 VOTED that the whole matter of the future status of the College of Agriculture be referred to the United Board's Committee on Program and Budget (which has inherited the functions of the Planning Committee) for study and review and that the subject be given further consideration by the Fukien Christian University Committee at its next meeting.

PLIGHT OF CHINESE STUDENTS IN AMERICA

The attention of the Committee was called to the plight of many Chinese students in America who are suffering both because of the difficulty of getting money from China and because they cannot return to China on account of the shipping strike. After discussion it was

F-30 VOTED that the Trustees of the United Board be asked to consider the advisability of approaching the State Department in regard to the possibility of easing the regulations restricting the employment of Chinese students in America, in view of the serious financial difficulties in which many of these students find themselves because of currency regulation in China and the difficulty of securing transportation to their homes.

It was suggested that the secretaries make preliminary investigations on how the situation can be alleviated.

ADJOURNMENT

The meeting then adjourned.

FOR THE YEAR ENDING JUNE 30, 1948

In spite of efforts on the part of a few students to disrupt work, the academic year of 1947-48 at Fukien was completed. Reports on the morale of the staff were good and it was because of this fact that the administration withstood all disturbances. More students were accommodated than in pre-war days but under great handicaps. Continued efforts were made to improve conditions on the campus.

In America efforts were centered in securing funds through the United Board and in turn through United Service to China. In the latter case income almost ceased thus requiring the United Board to inaugurate a campaign to secure Emergency Funds. Fukien shared in the distribution of these funds and was helped greatly thereby.

OFENING OF MEETING

Parents would be asked not only to guarantee the good behavior of their children but to furnish an additional guarantor.

C. T. YANG'S TRAVEL EXPENSES

The Committee discussed a request for \$1000 toward President C. T. Yang's travel expenses to and from the United States, which had come from the Board of Managers. It was

F-31 VOTED that after due consideration of the suggestion that \$1000 be appropriated for the expenses of Dr. C. T. Yang's trip to the United States the Fukien Christian University Committee regrets

that it cannot grant more than \$500 from its own resources but feels the rightness of such an action on behalf of Dr. Yang and requests the United Board to make a similar grant.

EXPRESSION OF SYMPATHY OVER PRESENT DIFFICULTIES

The Committee wished to record concern and sympathy for those persons faithfully carrying on at Fukien Christian University. It was

OPENING OF MEETING

The meeting was called to order by the Chairman, Dr. Frank T. Cartwright, Bishop Carleton Lacy offered the opening prayer. The Chairman expressed gratification that Bishop Michael Chang, Chairman of the Board of Directors and Bishop Lacy, a member of the Board were both present.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

The minutes of the meeting of the Interim Committee on February 28, 1949 were approved as circulated.

REPORTS AND COMMUNICATIONS FROM CHINA

Bishop Lacy reported on the present situation in Foochow, and the work of the Administrative Committee which is conducting the affairs of the University. He explained also the attitude of the Board of Directors on the matter of the presidency.

Letters were read from Prof. David Chang (April 21) and Miss Eva Asher (May 3). Members of the Committee shared news from lotters which they had received, and there was a general discussion of what changes to expect in the near future.

COLLEGE OF AGRICULTURE

It was reported that in reply to the request of the Fukien Christian University Committee for advice on this matter the Committee on Program and Budget gave the following recommendations:-

- 1. That the United Board reiterate its conviction that not more than one front rank college of agriculture with technical and specialized emphasis can be maintained at present by the Christian Missions in China and consequently that it is unwise for institutions other than the University of Nanking to establish anything so ambitious as a college of agriculture.
- 2. That it be recommended to Fukien Christian University that, while avoiding specialized technical training in agriculture, it make such changes in its academic organization and curriculum as to orient its entire program in direction of service to the rural community. (Attention is called to the plans for a College of Rural Economy at Cheeloo.)

This was discussed at length. The following resolution was proposed:-

The Fukien Christian University Committee having considered the recommendations of the Committee on Program and Budget in regard to the future of the College of Agriculture, does not wish to take definitive action at present, but when the time for decision arrives, if it appears clear that the United Board cannot support more than one front rank College of Agriculture with special technical emphasis, Fukien Christian University might well consider carefully making changes to orient its entire program in the direction of service to the rural community.

This resolution was discussed, but not adopted. Instead it was

F-33 VOTED to lay on the table the above proposed resolution on the future of the College of Agriculture.

Another action was proposed and adopted in the following form:-

F-34 VOTED to ask the Chairman of the Board of Directors to carry back the viewpoint of the United Board in regard to Colleges of Agriculture and to ask the Directors to express to us their judgment on the subject in view of the changing situation.

The term "minimum reserves" was applied to the appropriations by the United Board to bring the available reserves of the University to approximately \$25,000, the minimum amount deemed prudent in view of the present situation. It was hoped that these reserves would be enough to see the University through the next six months, even if it were cut off from regular sources of income.

REPORTS FROM THE FIELD

The Chairman gave a hearty welcome to Miss Eunice Thomas and Dr. and Mrs. Roderick Scott and asked them to make any statements they wished regarding the University and its work.

Miss Thomas spoke quite enthusiastically about the conditions prevailing on the campus during the Spring semester. Things were "back to normal." Friction and confusion seemed past. More students were joining the church than ever before.

This was largely due to the very fine administrative committee in charge of the College. She believed them, especially the chairman, Dr. David Cheng, very able and efficient. She spoke of Dr. Cheng's personal charm and deep conviction. The University thus enters upon a new experience as an integrated group with a real family spirit. This gives hope for the future under the new regime.

Dr. Scott spoke of the Christian Colleges as "the greatest part of the existing Christian movement." "Christianity is a going concern behind the bamboo curtain." The Christian leaders are planning far ahead.

Dr. Scott was dean during the strenuous times when F.C.V. students caused so much trou le. He spoke of the change during the last semester as "miraculous." There is a real spirit of equality and unity on the campus. This would be a surprise to many who write articles on Christian affairs. They urge that this be done when it is a present fact.

Mrs. Scott spoke of how delightful it was to have things quiet and happy. The music department had again reached a high point of interest and efficiency. "Robin Hood" had been given during the spring. Mrs. Scott also spoke of the fine work of the College of Agriculture and how well it was serving the villagers of the area. She likened Dean Lai Yung of the College of Agriculture to George Washington Carver and praised the experiments he was making with sweet potatoes and bean curd.

The Chairman thanked the guests for the contribution they had made to the understanding of the situation at F.C.U. and the encouragement they gave for the future.

a Christian emphasis, it would recommend to the United Board and all friends of Fukien Christian University the continuance of support for the University.

Dr. Cartwright was asked to make this Committee's report on findings to the United Board. (Appendix A)

FINANCIAL HATTERS

Mr. Seaman presented the Treasurer's report for the year ending June 1949, which was accepted. (Appendix B)

He also presented the budget for the first half of 1950-51. It was

The Chairman called the meeting to order and led in prayer.

REPORTS FROM THE FIELD

Serious consideration was given to the letter of December 16th signed by Dr. James L. Ding and Bishop Michael Chang in regard to the presidency of Fukien Christian University, particularly the following paragraphs:

"There is a Christian professor on the staff of the F.C.U. eminently fitted for the office of President. He has asked that for the present his name be not divulged. Heretofore he has been unwilling to undertake this responsibility, but with the University facing this critical situation, he has indicated to us, in a very confidential conversation his willingness to accept if the Board should think fit to appoint him as President, on the condition that the Board of Managers should approach the United Board of Christian Colleges for a special grant, in addition to the regular grant to enable him to increase slightly the salaries of the Faculty.

"Now it is just on this point about the financial position at F.C.U., we need your help and co-operation. We have been forced to give very low salaries to the professors and lecturers. Of all the universities in East China, universities like St. John's, Shanghai University, Nanking University, Ginling College, Hangchow College, Soochow College, the salary scale of F.C.U. is the lowest. The highest paid man on our staff is just about 500 catties of rice, whereas in any of the above mentioned universities it is some 1000 catties. So we agree that we do need desperately a special emergency grant at this moment.

"We therefore write to ask with all the force at our command that for the sake of Christian education in general, and for the sake of Christian education in F.C.U., you make a special effort to secure for us an Emergency Grant of \$12,000 in view of the desperate situation in F.C.U. The need is urgent as well as desperate. With the grant and the promise of a slight increase in the salaries of our teachers, we feel we can convince the professor mentioned above to take up this heavy responsibility at this time."

Dr. Fenn called attention to the following facts: that F.C.U. salaries in October appear to have been little lower than those at Yenching, that there is danger of recurring requests for such aid, and that other Colleges were also asking for special consideration.

After full discussion, it was

F-52 VOTED to recommend to the Trustees of the United Board that, when possible, a grant of \$12,000 be made to Fukien Christian University for the purposes indicated in the letter of December 16th from Dr. Ding and Bishop Chang.

The year 1950-51 was a crucial one for Fukien Christian University as it was for all the China Colleges. It saw the Institutions being shut off more and more from their friends in America, until, in December 1950, all direct communications were discontinued and it became illegal to send funds to Communist China.

From then on it was the aim of the United Board to conserve an adequate portion of the Colleges' surplus and reserves and current income for future use in China. Any position of the College's funds not required for a reserve of approximately two years normal operations was to be used, if determined to be available after review by legal counsel, for projects of the United Board related to higher education under Christian auspices for the youth of East Asia, especially Chinase.

ENDOWMENT SECTION

Funds in the Endowment Account increased \$139.86. This increase is made up as follows:

SPECIAL FUND INVESTMENTS CONSOLIDATED

On July 7, 1950 the United Board Trustees authorized the consolidation of the many Plant Funds, Managers Funds, Field Reserves, College Surpluses, etc. held in the U. S. A. into a common trust, similar to the Consolidated Endowment Fund. The purpose of this consolidation was to permit proper oversight and management by the Committee on Investment and Banking to earn a reasonable income which might be reinvested to increase the principal and income of the participating funds against the day of their use. As of June 30, 1951 Fukien Christian University participated in the Special Funds Consolidated Account to the extent of \$129,408.34 which was distributed as follows:

PLANT FULLDS

Plant Fund Investments were transferred to the new Special Funds Consolidated account on the books of the United Board as of July 1, 1950. For the purpose of this transfer the securities were valued at the closing market price on June 30, 1950.

Plant Funds increased during the year by \$1,316,22 to a new total of \$428,599.69 as follows:

Estimated income and approved expenditures within the current budget along with actual receipts and disbursements are shown in the Budget Analysis attached herewith as Schedule A.

It will be noted that actual receipts for the year totalled \$26,183.41 whereas estimated receipts were \$40,447.36. This was due principally to the fact that, when it became impossible to send funds to China, the United Board and Harvard-Yenching Institute no longer paid over to the College the amounts appropriated to it. The difference of \$14,263.95 between actual and budgeted receipts may be analyzed as follows:

Dear Friends:

Since all contact with our beloved University in China has been discontinued and since no funds were sent to China during the fiscal year 1951-52 the activity in the College accounts were reduced to a minimum. The annual report of the Treasurer to the United Board will be presented in a form that will give a complete financial picture of the stewardship of the United Board, including its administration of those funds it holds for the various Colleges.

Accordingly, the attached balance sheet and statement of receipts and disbursements for the fiscal year with respect to Fukien Christian University will be presented to the United Board as a component part of the Report of the Board's Treasurer and also as the Treasurer's Report to your Committee.

As you know, since June 1945 the Endowment Investments of Fukion Christian University have been consolidated with those of the other Colleges in a "common trust" in the accounts of the United Board.

Similarly, in June 1950 all investments of special funds and reserves of Fukien Christian University were consolidated in the United Board.

In January 1951, after the U. S. Treasury Department prohibited the sending of any funds to China, the Tukien Christian University cash accounts were transferred to the same bank account as those of the United Board.

At the present time, therefore, all each and investment assets, with the exception of those investments, totalling \$4,141.12, which are still not consolidated, are held by the United Board for the benefit of the University and are included in the United Board Treasurer's Report.

Oertain aspects of the enclosed statement of receipts and disbursements are of sufficient importance and interest to warrant special comment.

Of the \$10,034,23 shown in column 1 "Investment Income." \$6,633.89 was received from Endowment Investments and \$3,424.00 represents income from Special Funds invested.

The Endowment Income equals 4.17% on investments held at the beginning of the fiscal year as compared with 4.41% for the previous year computed on the same basis.

The disbursements shown include the payment of continuing subscriptions on medical and technical journals and the storage charges for accumulating copies of these. These journals will be made available to Tukien Christian University or some other Institution when shipment to China is again feasible.

The activity for the year which normally would fall within the College budget resulted in an excess of receipts over disbursements amounting to \$10,437.08. In previous years this would have been considered an operating surplus and would have been set aside for the University to draw upon during a succeeding budget period. Accordingly, it is

RECOMMENDED that since the surplus of \$10,437.08 is the result of normal budgetary receipts in excess of disbursements, it be transferred to accounts payable and held for disposition by the Fukien Christian University Committee and the United Board Trustees.

Chambellan, Berger and Welti. These statements have been prepared as Exhibit E of the Report of the Treasurer to the United Board.

Since all contact with our beloved University in China has been discontinued and since no funds were sent to China during the fiscal year 1954-55, the activity in the College accounts was reduced to a minimum. The annual report of the Treasurer to the United Board will be presented in a form that will give a complete financial picture of the stewardship of the United Board, including its administration of those funds it holds for the various Colleges.

Accordingly, the attached balance sheet and statement of receipts and disbursements for the fiscal year with respect to Fukien Christian University will be presented to the United Board as a component part of the Report of the Board's Treasurer and also as the Treasurer's Report to your Committee.

At the present time, all cash and investment assets, with the exception of those investments, totaling \$3,083.50, which are still not consolidated, are held by the United Board for the benefit of Fukien Christian University and are included in the United Board Treasurer's Report.

The Endowment Income equals 4.28% on investments held at the beginning of the fiscal year as compared with 4.18% for the previous year computed on the same basis.

The accumulated income to June 30, 1954 and quarterly thereafter, from the Charles M. Hall Endowment Fund was transferred to the United Board's General Fund by action T-1174 of the Trustees at their meeting January 15, 1954.
