I quote below an extract from a letter written by President C. J. Lin on September 14th.

"Your latter of September 12, in reply to my telegram, and the building sketches and our women's dormitory pictures, has just been received.

There is strong possibility of securing a gift of \$20,000 (twenty thousand dollars) from a Dr. W. F. Pierce, Los Angeles, for our somen's dormitory at whien. In fact he has definitely promised for that amount, and the American Board at Boston, has officially authorized the gift to be turned over to us shen the cash is in. Dr. Pierce is a Congregationalist.

Dr. Pierce is also willing to give \$50,000 for the Union Hospital Building in Foochow. But the American Board people seem to be in favor of a hospital building in Turkey, and are still trying to persuade Dr. Pierce to do that. as I am not an authorized agent of the Foochow Union Hospital, nor am I connected with it in any official way, that I cannot do much further for the Poochow hospital. Dr. Pierce wishes to make the hospital building a momorial to himself before he dies. He has been 40 years a physician. He is not at all interested in our library plan at Fukien. Should Dr. Pierce finally decide to make his gift to Foochow hospital I shall have to leave the hospital plans with the Congregational people at Los Angeles for further use. Please tell the Methodist Board about this possibility. The responsible person here, is Dr. E. D. Osylord, superintendent of the Congregational Churches in Southern California (129 %. 2nd Street, Los Angeles). It was he who sent me to see Dr. Pierce first. Yesterday morning, Dr. Gaylord and a lawyer, Er. Franklin, and I, were in to see Dr. Pierce for the second time."

I am writing to express to you the profound gratitude of the Board of Trustees of Fukien Christian University for the gift of \$20,000 which you have so generously made for the Women's Dormitory building at the University, henceforth to be known as the "Orlinda Childs Pierce Memorial."

At a meeting of the Board of Founders on September 28th formal action was taken accepting this gift, as follows:

"VOTED that the Board of Trustees of Fukien Christian University record its profound appreciation of the gift of \$20,000 offered by Dr. ". F. Pierce through the American Board of Commissioners for Foreign Missions to cover the cost of the Women's Dormitory building at Fukien Christian University, and that the Trustees accept this gift as a contribution from American Board sources for building purposes on the following conditions:-

- "1. That this sum is accepted as a full payment of the cost of the Women's Dormitory building recently erected at said University;
- "2. That said building be used as a dormitory for women only;
- "3. That the name "Orlinda Childs Pierce Memorial" be inscribed in raised letters on the front of said building."

We at once notified the American Board of the above action, and they have now transmitted the \$20,000 to us.

We feel that the receipt of this generous gift just at this time is truly providential. During recent years Fukien Christian University has begun in a serious way its service to the young womanhood of China. But it has been terribly hampered by lack of funds to provide adequate facilities for them. Within recent months we have been facing unique opportunities to enlarge greatly the scope of our service to young women if only we could find the funds necessary to seize the opportunity presented to us. We believe that your gift is the answer to this need, and that it will be multiplied many fold in its enlargement of our service to Chinese young womanhood.

My dear Doctor Pierce:

I have been informed that your gift of \$20,000.00 for the Orlinda Childs Pierce Memorial at Fukien Christian University, Foochow, China, has been received by our office here through the American Board in Boston. I hope that you have received a letter from the Secretary of our Board of Trustees expressing their gratitude for your generous gift to our work. Your gift meets one of our most urgent needs, and we appreciate it so much more that you have done it at this time. The Memorial building is a permanent monument marking your love to Mrs. Pierce, and your devotion to the Christian mission. You can be sure that your investment in the building of Christian character is most worthwhile.

I have sent words to China to put on the Memorial inscription as soon as they receive the inscription as prepared by the architect, and as shown to you on September 17th. A copy of the enlarged photograph of Mrs. Pierce has also been sent to Foochow. Our people have been instructed to frame the same and to hang it in the main hall of the Memorial building. I was also glad that you let me have a copy of your own photograph. Our office here is planning to use it in connection with one of our Bulletins to be issued in the near future.

Women students in our University has been increased this year about 30%. Women students from all parts of the Fukien megion are coming to us for Christian higher education since we have a dornitory for them. We are really in need of more educational equipment, such as a building costing about \$10,000.00 for Domestic Science and Home Economics, which will prepare the young women to render Christian service more effectively. We also need an endowment fund of \$30,000.00 to insure the maintenance of our women's building, and continuance of the work. I hope that it may be possible for you some time to make a contribution toward those needs we containly appreciate your cooperation in making the memorial Dornitory Building possible, and we know that you will be willing to cooperate with us further in our endeavor in Christian service to the Chinese.

As you may already have learned, President Lin is now on his way to the United States and will be spending the next year here. I hope that you may have an opportunity to meet him.




