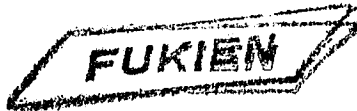

The Weekly Bulletin: The Bulletin will be issued each Saturday, giving notices covering the activities of the following week, and various items of interest to the F.C.U. community. Faculty members, officers, and student leaders are earnestly requested to cooperate in helping to make the Bulletin a success by sending in news items to Miss Asher, at the Treasurer's Office, by Friday afternoon of each week.

Registration: The regular registration period closed yesterday ~~at~~ at noon, at which time 165 students had registered, 25 of whom are women. About 5 more students are expected to register, making an approximate total student body of 170 for the fall semester.

Departmental personnel: The Biology Department is fortunate in having additional help this year in the person of Professor C. N. Yang. Mr. Yang was trained abroad, and has had considerable teaching and research experience in several educational institutions in China since his return to this country.

F.C.U. and friends are glad to welcome back two graduates of the class of 1933: Mr. Tai Wen Sai as Graduate Assistant in the Department of Physics and Mathematics, and Mr. Lin Wei Chieh in the Department of Chemistry.

Mr. Lin I, formerly of the Chemistry Department, is studying in Yenching University, Beijing, on a Rockefeller Foundation fellowship.

President Lin was away from the campus five weeks during the summer, attending the Christian Literature Conference at Kuling.

Dr. W. Y. Chen was away for about two weeks in August, in Shanghai and Pootoo Island. He attended a conference for young people at Pootoo Island, the conference being held under the auspices of the Southern Methodist Church.

The first motor car made its appearances on the F.C.U. campus Saturday morning, September 16, 1933. Miss Eva Asher, the Treasurer, rode on it for a pleasure trip to the city and found it to be a most welcomed relaxation after the busy days of registration week.

For sometime we have been looking forward to a visit from Miss Margery Fry, J.P., M.A., LL.D., of the Universities' China Committee of London (supported by the British Indemnity Fund), and her traveling companion, Miss Michaelis. We are expecting Dr. Fry and Miss Michaelis to arrive on the Chipsing Thursday, December 14, and to be with us until Sunday, the 17th.

On Friday and Saturday Morning, 10:00 - 11:30, Dr. Fry will give a series of two lectures on Education in England. To make this possible, the following adjustment in the schedule will have to be made: (1) Friday: Classes coming in the fourth period of morning will not meet, but classes which usually come at 10:30 on Friday will meet at 11:30. (2) Saturday: Classes which come at 10:00 will not meet, and the 11:00 o'clock classes will meet at 11:30.

Besides the two lectures on Friday and Saturday morning, lectures have been arranged for Thursday evening and Friday evening. One of the evening lectures will be given by Dr. Fry on Penal Reform in England, and the other evening lecture will be given by Miss Michaelis on Child Health.

The Science departments of F.C.U. have recently received from the Bureau of Education Certificates of Award for the first prizes in Biology, Chemistry, and Physics in the Natural Science Exhibit sponsored by the Bureau for all Fukien and held last May in Foochow.

The experimentation on tomato raising, in charge of Mr. Chang Tien Fu, has been completed, and seeds of four different varieties are on sale in the Biology Department at 5¢ a packet.

In connection with the benefit campaign for refugees from Northwest Fukien, the Fukien Christian Students Association is sending speakers to all the Christian Schools in Foochow during the week, December 11-16. The Association has made a survey of the number of refugees, about 1200, and their needs: (1) Warm bed covers 44, (2) Winter clothes 159, (3) Plain clothes 244, (4) Children's clothes 198, (5) Warm hats or caps 18.

Chapel theme for the week: "What is the 'Good Life' in Times like These?"

Foochow City was bombed by Nanking aeroplanes four days in succession, December 22 - 25. Only three or four bombs were dropped the first two days, and about 20 and 26, respectively, the last two days. While naturally the people were greatly frightened, comparatively little damage was done. According to verified reports a few houses were destroyed and about 20 people killed. There has been no bombing since the 25th, thus greatly relieving the tension.

Work at F.C.U. has been going on as usual. On account of the bombing in Foochow City December 22-25 and the tense situation which followed, the schools in the city were all compelled to close. Schools on Nantai have remained open because it was generally considered that this would be a more or less neutral zone.

It was reported last week that \$50 was realized from the sale of Christmas stars, to be used for refugee work. Now the figure is reported to be \$70.00.

The Fukien Union Rural Service Council has been organized. It consists of three representatives of the Boards of Managers of Fukien Christian University and Foochow Union High School. The Council has taken action with regard to authorizing the rural service work in both of these institutions. F.C.U. will probably start its work in the spring. The members of the Council are:
