She is a Christian of rare charm and personality, and, if we may judge from reports of her visits and speeches in other parts of China, she is a speaker of rare power.

This opportunity to meet and hear Miss Lester is not one to be lightly cast aside.

Miss Lester is one of the founders of the International Fellowship of Reconciliation. She is also the founder of an important settlement in London where she has done a great deal for the poor.

We have had the pleasure of having Miss Lester with us here on the F.C.U. Campus since yesterday morning, Friday. She spoke three times during the day, as follows:

10:00 a.m. Chapel - "Why Worship?"

4:30 a.m. To students and others, under the auspices of the S.C.A., at which time she told of her settlement work in East London; how she became interested in it, and something of the organization of it, and the service that it has rendered to the people in that section of London.

8:00 p.m. To the Faculty at President Lin's home
After a trip to Kushan this morning, Saturday, Miss Lester will return to Foochow. She arrived in Foochow last Wednesday from Shanghai on the "Chipsing", and will leave for Hongkong tomorrow, January 7.

We are glad to welcome to our campus Dr. Francis Chen who arrived from Hongkong last Monday, January 1.

Miss Huang Siu Chi finds that she will not be able to attend the National Y.M.C.A. Conference in Shanghai, January 23-28. Mr. Hsu Yu En, who received the third highest number of votes when the delegates were elected, will take her place. So the two delegates from F.C.U. are Mr. Liu Ching Sheng and Mr. Hsu Yu En.

The Student Christian Association Cabinet retreat will be held tomorrow, Sunday, March 11, at Mill Valley. The group will meet in front of the Arts Hall at 7:30 a.m. In case it should be raining, the meeting will be held in the attic of the women's dormitory. Lunch will be provided.

Students who wish to become members of the S.C.A. are asked to see Miss Chiang Yu Yin or Mr. Lin Ta En.

Night school for workmen and servants, under the auspices of the S.C.A., will begin Thursday night, March 15, with Mr. Li Yung in charge. Families are requested to notify their servants of same.

Dr. Francis Chen has been appointed Director of our rural service work. A faculty committee has been appointed to help work out plans and to act in an advisory capacity; generally: Dr. W. Y. Chen, Chairman, Prof. E. M. Stowe, and Prof. T. H. Wang. The village of Yuan Yang, a little ways above Kushan Point on the road to Foochow, has been chosen as our experiment station. We hope to secure a full-time secretary to reside in the village.

Prof. T.L. Lin, who is a member of the Government Literacy Movement, is also working in close cooperation with Dr. F. Chen and the committee. The government has assigned all of the villages from Yuan Yang to Kwei Chi to us, and the Commissioner of Education has reported to Prof. Lin that two teaching jobs for conducting adult night schools are available for which the government will be responsible for the expenses. Prof. Lin is working out plans that will link this work up with our rural program at Yuan Yang.

A plan has been initiated whereby certain students will undertake to conduct in nearby villages the leadership of clubs for boys and girls. Two points where this will be carried on are Kwei Chi, our nearest neighbor, and Yuan Yang. The work will be carried on in connection with the Department of Education and the other features of the rural service program.

F.C.U. Christian Fellowship Funds for 1933 amounted to \$227.47. The Religious Activities Committee directed the following distribution: The Blind Girls' School, \$56.07; the Blind Boys' School, \$50.00; Youth Clubs per Mr. Tiang Cu Gi, \$25.00; the Kwei Chi Night School, \$20.00; F.C.U. Student Christian Association, Fukien Children's Home, Christian Herald Orphanage, North Fukien Christian Students' Union and West Gate Church each \$10.00. About \$90.00 is expected as a minimum for the Spring Term, 1934. The budget for this is as follows:- The two Blind Schools, each \$25.00; F.C.U. S.C.A., \$15.00; N.F.C.S.U., \$10.00, leaving \$15.00 not yet allocated.

On Monday, March 12, the National Arbor Day will be observed. Immediately following the Memorial Meeting, students and faculty are asked to meet on the athletic field, about 10:00 a.m., where they will be divided into groups and given definite instructions as to when to go to plant trees.

Mr. Tan is representing the Fukien Christian Educational Association. Dean Chen will also attend the meeting of the Educational Department Heads of all the Christian universities in China.

Dr. Chen will conduct the devotional services of the conference. 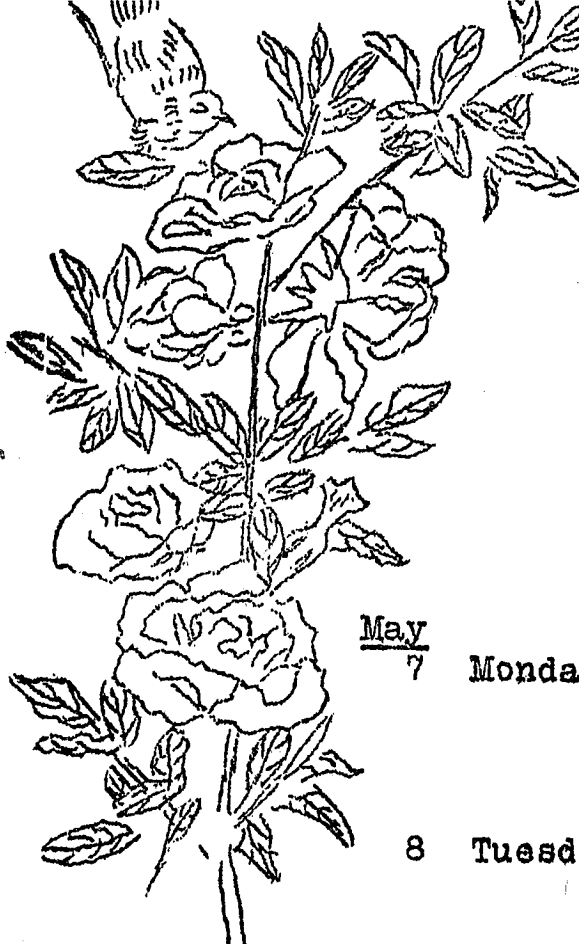

Prof. Scott reports a most satisfactory trip to Amoy, Changchow, and Chuanchow where he met and talked with many of the F.C.U. alumni of South Fukien, both in groups and individually. He was also warmly received by the students in these places. During the week he was there Prof. Scott made 17 speeches, using 14 titles, to 3000 persons.

The faculty has recently approved the following tuition scholarships for the advancement of academic excellency:

1. Scholarship for the Senior year, given to the best Junior. This to be known as the Chen Scholarship, in honor of the donor of the special Chinese library.
2. Two Scholarships for the Junior year, given to the two best Sophomores, the first one to be the Chen Scholarship and the other one to be a university scholarship.
3. Three Scholarships for the Sophomore year, given to the three best freshmen, the first to be the Chen Scholarship and the other two to be a university scholarship.
4. Three scholarships for the Freshmen year, given to the three best candidates for admission.

All of the above are tuition scholarships amounting to M\$80 a year. Good character and a minimum average grade of 2 are required for all scholarships.

The following special scholarships are offered:

1. A medical scholarship, amounting to \$70 a year, made possible by a gift from friends of Dr. Neil H. Lewis who was formerly connected with the Foochow Union Hospital. This scholarship will be awarded to the best student each year who has completed the premedical course at F.C.U. and actually goes on to medical school.
2. The Yi-Yon Scholarship, amounting to \$100 a year, will be awarded to the best student majoring in science studies.
3. A number of half scholarships, amounting to \$40 a year, will be awarded to the best Senior of each accredited school, provided that he passes our entrance examinations with a grade of 3 or above in all subjects.

Faculty members and graduating seniors are invited to have lunch with the alumni on Sunday, June 17.

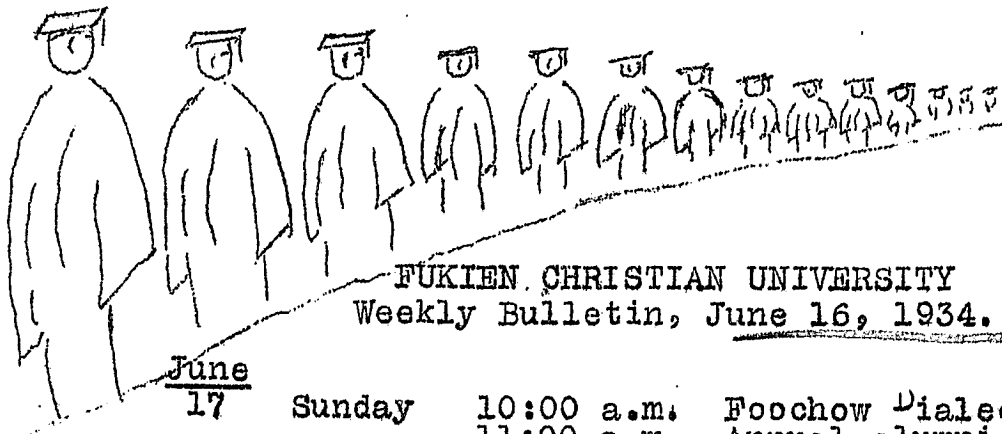

We also welcome two members of the June graduating class who have joined our staff: Mr. Cheng Chung Fu as Graduate Assistant in the Biology Department, and Mr. Lin Fa Tung as Graduate Assistant in the Library.

Recent word has come from Dr. Gerhard A. Brecher, Dresden, Germany, stating that he will not be able to join our staff this fall as previously planned on account of the health conditions of his Mother.

Due to health reasons, it is necessary for Mrs. Martin to return to her home in Australia. She left Foochow on September 9, and will sail from Hongkong on September 18. Prof. Martin will stay here until the end of the school year, June 1935.

The Chemistry Society will hold its first meeting of the term on Tuesday, September 25, at 7:00 p.m., in the Science Hall. Prof. T. H. Wang will give a short lecture, after which some of the old members will explain the meaning and purpose of the Society. All new students who are interested in Chemistry are invited to attend.

A 22-inch ultra violet lamp has been installed in a cabinet on the Chemistry floor of the Science Hall. Minerals and certain chemicals show beautiful fluorescence when exposed to this lamp. Visitors may see the lamp at any time.

Last summer a large meteorite, weighing more than 1000 lbs, was brought here from Mintsing, and is now on display on the Chemistry department floor of the Science Hall. Mr. F. O. Stockwell purchased this specimen and had it carried many miles overland to the boat which brought it to our campus.

Dr. Carol Chen of the Hwa Nan College faculty will give a two-hour course in Education - "Secondary School Teaching" - at F.C.U. on Saturday mornings, 10:00 - 12:00.

Dr. Francis Chen and Mr. Chang Tien Fu visited the leading rural experiment stations in North China and some of the more important stations in Japan during the summer. From North China they went to Japan by way of Manchuria and Korea, and returned to Foochow by way of Formosa. They secured more than 300 pamphlets and books on rural life, all of which were published by the various experiment stations in China and Japan. These publications will be used as a beginning for building up a library for the village people. They were on display in the faculty room yesterday. While in Nanking Dr. Chen gave some lectures on rural economy at the University of Nanking.

A community program for the promotion of rural service was given in the Chapel last evening under the auspices of the Rural Service Committee, the Rural Service Club, the Chinese Boxing Club, and the Student Christian Association. Dr. W. Y. Chen spoke on "The Urgency of Rural Reconstruction"; F. Chen gave a report on the work that has been done at Nieu Tien and other nearby villages; the Rural Service Club gave a drama depicting present rural life, and some of the members of the Boxing Club gave demonstrations of Chinese boxing. The meeting was well attended by faculty, students, and workmen.

It was a great shock to our community to hear of the sudden death of Mr. Chiang Jen Yu Wednesday night, September 19, due to cerebral hemorrhages. The attack came on early in the evening and he was immediately taken to the Union Hospital in Foochow where he died soon after arriving. Mr. Chiang graduated from F.C.U. in June 1932, and since that time he has been a faithful member of our staff as Graduate Assistant in the Biology Department.

Prof. Scott has received a cable announcing the death of his mother, on September 15, at the age of 81. Many friends will remember the three-year sojourn of Dr. and Mrs. Scott at F.C.U. and the share they took in the campus life.

It was a great pleasure to the F.C.U. community to have Mrs. Hyam of Washington, D.C., visit us yesterday morning. Mrs. Hyam, who is now 72 years of age, has long been interested in Christian missions and has been an indefatigable worker for same at the home end. Now it is her good fortune to be able to visit many of the places in which she has been deeply interested through the years. Mrs. Hyam brought us a most inspiring message at the chapel service.

We are happy to welcome to our campus this morning two W.F.M.S. secretaries of the Methodist Episcopal Church in America, Mrs. Baker and Mrs. Peale, who are visiting Foochow at this time in the interest of mission work.

The Social Service Department of the Student Christian Association is conducting a night school for the workmen on the campus. The school has been in session for three weeks. Classes are held five nights a week. There are 18 students and 5 teachers: Mr. Chiang Chung Ying, Mr. Liang Ching Hua, Mr. Ting Ping Hsin, Mr. Yang Shu Fang, and Mr. Lin En Ching, with Mr. Chiang Chung Ying in charge.

The Social Service Department of the S.C.A. is also conducting some rural service work in Nieu Tien Village. Two service groups have been organized, one for children and one for adults. Both the men and women students are participating in this work, with about five in each group. They go to the village every Sunday afternoon, and have been warmly received by the villagers.

Prof. F. C. Martin reports that about 20 European Radio Stations have been heard on the broadcast band by the new radion set of the Physics Department in the early morning before sunrise; also three stations on the short waves, Germany, Russia, and Australia in the evening. A stethoscope is used to magnify the sound from these distant stations and through an acoustic filter which reduces the background noises. The aerial is a "doublet".

Mr. Chang Tien Fu reports the recent receipt of a letter from Prof. C.S. Wang who was formerly a member of our faculty and who is now on the staff of the University of Shanghai. He wishes to be remembered to all F.C.U. friends.

The Chinese Boxing Club meets every morning from 6:30 to 7:00 on the tennis court. Mr. Tseng Chien Chun of the Bureau of Public Safety and a friend of Mr. Chang Tien Fu, voluntarily comes down once a week to teach Western boxing.

Dr. and Mrs. Lewis Hodous will visit the campus on Wednesday and Thursday. Dr. Hodous was one of the founders and first teachers of F.C.U., and is now a member of the Board of Trustees, professor of Chinese Literature in Hartford Seminary, Hartford, Connecticut, and one of the foremost Buddhist scholars of America. He will speak to the faculty Wednesday night in the home of Prof. and Mrs. Scott, and will lead the chapel service Thursday morning.

Prof. E. M. Stowe left for Shanghai last Wednesday, November 7, to attend a meeting of the National Committee for Religious Education, November 10 - 13. Prof. Stowe is the Chairman of the sub-committee of the Middle School Section.

Under the auspices of the Fukien Provincial Government, a special commission of about 18 persons has been organized to go to Formosa to make a careful investigation of the social, economic, and cultural conditions of the Island, with special attention to the construction works that have been completed. Mr. Chang Tien Fu of our Biology Department has been asked to join this commission as an expert in agriculture. The Commission will leave Foochow on November 13 and will return on November 27.

We have had the pleasure of entertaining the following groups of visitors on the campus during the last ten days:

- (1) The delegates to the National Electric Association which was held in Foochow last week. The delegates numbering about 120 persons came to us in two groups. Both groups spent a good deal of time visiting the science laboratories, the library, and other parts of the campus.
- (2) A group of more than 30 students from the Anglo-Chinese College, Amoy. We were glad to be able to furnish them accommodations in the dormitories for a week. The principal of the school, Mr. Shen Sheng Yu, is a graduate of F.C.U. ('33).
- (3) The senior class of the Yu Teh Girls Middle School, Amoy, numbering 15, accompanied by two teachers of the school. They spent one day here. The principal of this school, Mr. Shao Ching Yuan, is also a graduate of F.C.U. ('34).
- (4) A party from the Police Commissioner's Office, led by the Commissioner himself.

The attention of the community, and especially of new students, is called to the long glass case under the window on the far side of the University Library. In this case are exhibited articles depicting various phases in the evolution of writing, printing, and books, as well as objects illustrating the history of Chinese Art from Chou Dynasty to the present day. These exhibits are changed from time to time, each exhibit being on view for about a month. At present the contents of the case are specimens of the ceramic art of the Sung Dynasty. The ware is what is known as Celadon in the West, and in China as Lung Ch'uan Yao. The typed cards in the case give something of the history of it and its interest for the history of Fukien. The exhibits are arranged by Prof. M. F. Farley.

In the interest of the New Life Movement a holiday was declared yesterday afternoon, Friday, for the faculty and students to visit three nearby villages: Nieu Tien, Yang Li, and San Tao. The student body and faculty were divided into three groups, one group for each village. Mr. Song Chih Jen, President of the S.C.A., was in general charge of the groups. In addition, each group had a Captain and an assistant. All of the groups worked on the same basic principles, such as giving lectures on health and cleanliness, as well as actually cleaning up the streets, and going into the homes to distribute handbills and posters on health. In each place the villagers were urged to continue this health campaign themselves.

The Faculty Bible Study Class, conducted by Prof. E. M. Stowe, will meet each Thursday evening at 8:00 o'clock at the home of Prof. and Mrs. Stowe.

The Executive Committee of the National Committee for Christian Religious Education in China has requested the administration of F.C.U. for the full-time service of Prof. E. M. Stowe for a period of four months, beginning with the end of the present semester. The request has been granted by the administration. This work has especially to do with the middle school enterprise of the above committee. It will involve visiting and becoming familiar with actual conditions in a number of middle schools and planning for the third session of the Council of Youth Workers. The latter will meet in Shanghai sometime in April. In conjunction with the Council of Secondary Education, it is hoped also to take advantage of the visit of Dean Weigle of Yale University and to secure his presence at that meeting.

The Chemistry Department is planning to build a dark room in the attic of the Science Hall to be used for spectroscopy, polarimetry, and photomicrography.

Dr. Chiu Shao Ling of the Cha Chang Hospital in the city, who gives voluntary service to our clinic at Nieu Tien one day every week, is offering free vaccination to all of the children of the surrounding villages. The Public Health Department of the Fukien Government is furnishing the vaccine.

Prof. Chen Pei Lan of Hwa Nan College brought a group of Hwa Nan students to visit our village work one day this week. They visited in many of the homes.

The landing station for the Foochow stop of the Shanghai-Canton Air Line has been moved from Hei Tao to Kushan Point, just beyond the edge of the F.C.U. Campus. The pontoon is out in the river a short distance from the bank. Members of the F.C.U. community were interested in seeing the first landing at the new station yesterday morning at 10:00 o'clock. The plane came down between Hui-gie and our Jetty, and taxied up the river to the pontoon.

Prof. T. L. Lin spoke at the Foochow Rotary Club meeting last Thursday on "Social Problems in the Communist Infested Districts of Fukien".

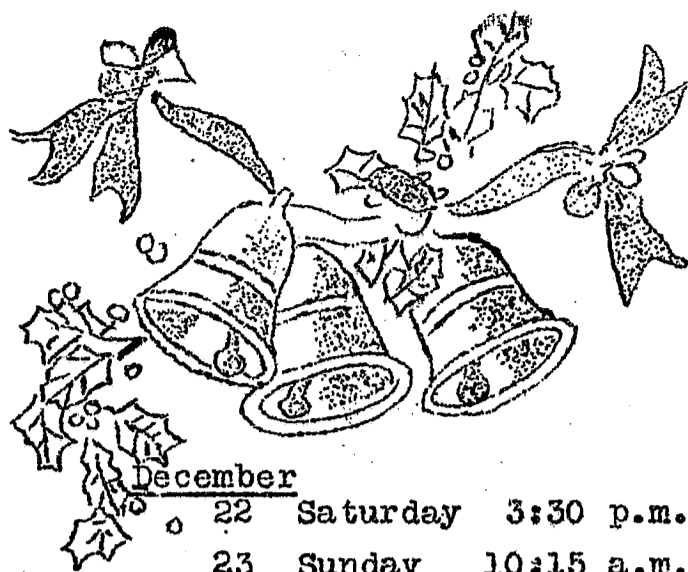
