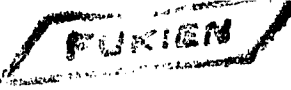

N O T I C E S

The central theme for the chapel services this coming week, the last week of the fall semester, will be "Unity Through Loyalty to Christ".

The Christmas offering received at the S.C.A. celebration on December 24 amounted to \$33.00. This offering will be used in the region of Fukien suffering from famine conditions. A more detailed report will be given next week.

The officers of the Fukien Culture Society will meet at Prof. T. L. Lin's home Monday evening, January 7, at 7:00 o'clock, to discuss plans for the six divisions of the Society, and also to discuss plans for the work that has already been proposed to be done during the winter vacation.

The Chinese Department has just put out a publication, "Hsieh Ta Yi Wen", consisting chiefly of the reports of research work done in Chinese Literature and Poetry by the major students in Chinese. The publication will be on sale at the F.C.U. Bookstore, and at the Commercial Press and the Chung Hua Press, Foochow, at 20¢ per copy.

Students who desire to apply for Aidship for the Spring Semester, 1935, will please fill in application blanks, which can be obtained from Mr. Tan at his office, and return same to Mr. Tan on or before January 15.

Dr. Chiu Shao Lin has prepared a series of lectures on "The Prevention of Common Diseases", one of which he gives to the village people at Nieu Tien each Monday when he comes for clinic work.

The Treasurer's Office has recently checked up the receipts from the sale of launch tickets, and finds that since the buses have been running the receipts have fallen off about 35%, compared with the same months of last year. Unless the receipts are increased we shall have to reduce our launch service to the university. At best the university has to subsidize the launch about \$900 a year. Whether or not we shall be able to maintain the launch service will depend on how much the faculty and students use the launch.

The Social Science Club has been extended an invitation by the Ming Hao Court and the Provincial Court to attend court in session.

The Deans Office announces the following:

- (1) The schedule for next term has been made out and posted. Students finding conflicts in classes should report same to the office before the end of the week ending January 19.
- (2) No new class will be admitted next term, but transfer students will be received. Application should be made before February 5. Entrance Exams for transfer students will be given on Feb. 12.
- (3) Students are asked to hand in their course books before they leave the campus, so that the grades for this semester may be recorded during the vacation.

The Library will observe the regular hours through the Exam period.

X On January 28-30, there will be held on the F.C.U. campus a special conference on problems of Student Life and Religious Education in the Christian schools of Foochow. The conference, held under the auspices of the Christian Schools Teachers Association of Foochow, will be attended by teachers and administrators from all the Christian schools in Foochow. For those not familiar with the activity of the Teachers Association, it might be explained that this Association has been in existence for more than two years, with Dean T.H.E. Chen as Chairman. This year the Association has organized the teachers into groups for the study of special problems, such as methods of teaching different subjects. The conference to be held on January 28-30 has been initiated by a group studying the problems of student life and religious education.

The F.C.U. Foochow Alumni will meet here on the campus Sunday morning, January 13. The faculty members are invited to have lunch with them at the home of Dr. W. Y. Chen, at 12:30.

Dr. W. Y. Chen and Dr. W. J. Sutton will leave for Shanghai soon after the close of this semester on January 22, to attend a meeting of the Council of Higher Education, beginning January 29.

X Miss Huang Siu Chi will go to Shanghai to attend the annual meeting of the Executive Committee of the Student Christian Movement, to be held January 22-26. This meeting will be made up of the chairmen of local unions of school associations and of delegates elected by these unions. Miss Huang attends as the Chairman of the North Fukien Union. She will also attend the meeting of the Standing Committee of College Women's Federation, January 27-29.

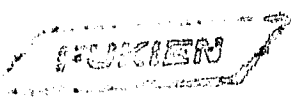
Mr. Sung Chih Jen and Mr. Lin En Ching will go to Shanghai to attend the National Convention of the Y.M.C.A., January 27-29, Mr. Sung as a representative of the F.C.U. Student Christian Association, and Mr. Lin as a representative of the North Fukien Christian Students Union.

X Prof. E. M. Stowe announces that his special work during next term for the National Committee for Christian Religious Education will take him to East China, and to certain places in South China. The purpose of these visits will be to study the most recent problems of middle schools with respect to character building aims. Especial attention will be given to experiments concerning relating the school better to the social order. The work will conclude with a meeting of the Council of Youth Workers in Shanghai near the end of April.

Dr. Francis Chen reports a gift of \$10 U.S. Currency (M\$28.03) from Mrs. Mary F. Balderston for the purchase of a small organ for the Elementary School at Nicu Tien.

X The Fukien Culture Society has made the following plans for the six divisions.

1. Races: Study the boatmen of the Min River.
2. Languages: Study of the dialects of Northern Fukien, and a study of the classification and distribution of all dialects of Fukien.
3. Natural Products: Study of the principal products of Fukien, their usage, resources, method of production, market conditions.
4. Social Customs: Study of popular songs of Foochow.
5. History and Geography: Study of several famous scholars of Fukien.
6. Folklore: Study of a collection of Fukien folklore, its distribution and interpretation.

Faculty families please note, and remind those who are working for you, that the time for the Foochow Dialect Service has been changed to 9:45 a.m.

A son was born to Mr. and Mrs. Y. C. Lin on February 17.

Mrs. F. C. Martin reports that she has been having hospital treatment and that she is getting along nicely.

The people of Nieu Lien village have built a road from the village to the Fu-Ma Highway. Rickshas and other vehicles can go direct to the village now. The whole project was worked out and paid for by the village people, under the leadership of the Young Farmers Club.

During the winter vacation Professor M. F. Farley spent three weeks in Shanghai and Nanking. The trip was taken in the interests of Chinese Art and Archaeology, and for the purpose of visiting some of the institutions of higher education. Institutions visited were the University of Shanghai, Central University, the University of Nanking, including the Institute of Chinese Studies and Ginling College. Prof. Farley lectured to the Nanking Women's Club on Chinese Ceramics and to the Faculty Club of the University of Shanghai. His work in Chinese Art and Archaeology included the following visits to private collections in Shanghai and Nanking: visits to the various museums; visits and conferences with some of the leading specialists of Europe on Chinese Art and Archaeology, who were in Shanghai; extensive investigation of the Shanghai antique market; and the acquisition of more than a hundred objects of bronze and pottery from the Chou Dynasty to the Sung Dynasty. In Nanking, Prof. Farley visited all the buildings and institutions of the Central Government, as well as the remains of historic Nanking, the Ming tombs, and the six groups of Liang tombs in the country outside of Nanking.

Under the auspices of the Student Relations Committee, the building formerly used for student dining room and recently used for the S.C.A. recreation hall, is being remodeled to serve as a Student Center, in which will be housed all of the principal student activities, such as the S.C.A. reading room, offices for the S.C.A. and the S.G.A., ping pang room, "chatting corners", etc., etc. With the enlargement of window space, the building now admits about twice as much light as it did before. The committee is having new furniture made for the different rooms, and the building will be opened for use about the middle of March.

The Natural History Society held its first meeting of this semester at the home of Dr. T. H. Cheng last Wednesday evening, February 20. Dr. Cheng gave a short speech on the Opportunities of Biological Research for F.C.U. students. The Society is taking on new members during this week. Those who are interested in the Natural Sciences are welcome. The Society is planning a collecting trip to Mill Valley this afternoon, Saturday. The group will start from the F.C.U. jetty at 1:30 p.m.

O T H E R N O T I C E S

Beginning from March 11, the time for the Monday morning Memorial Meeting and Convocation will be changed from 9:50 a.m. to 8:00 a.m. From then on, students and faculty will gather in front of the Arts Hall every Monday morning at 7:50 for a brief flag-raising ceremony, after which the group will go to the Assembly Hall for the Memorial Meeting. The first class on Monday will begin at 8:55 a.m.; a detailed schedule soon.

The whole of the opera "Carmen" will be played on the victrola on Thursday and Friday nights, March 7 and 8, in the Chapel, beginning at 7:15. Because of the length of the opera, only Act I and Act II will be played Thursday night, and Act III and Act IV will be played Friday night. Dean Chen's radio-victrola will be used.

The room at the left of the entrance to the Arts Hall has been set aside this term as the RUTH WARD BEACH MEMORIAL STUDIO. Thanks to Professor Beach's generosity and cooperation, the piano and desk and bookcase which belonged to Mrs. Beach are in the room. Mrs. Beach's large library of piano music is also in the room for the present at the disposal of the Music Department. All of the music equipment of the University will be kept in this room. The committee is also making further plans for the expenditure of the Ruth Ward Beach Memorial Fund for equipment for this room, in the way of furniture, pictures, Victrola records illustrating the History of Music Course, and possibly a victrola with amplifier for use in the Chapel.

Dean T.H.E. Chen has been asked to serve as a member of a committee newly appointed by the Commissioner of Education to study the conditions of music education in Foochow and to make recommendations for its improvement. The Committee held its first meeting last Saturday for a general discussion of the scope of its activities. Two sub-committees were formed: (1) Study of Music education in schools; (2) Study of Music in Social Education.

A Bible Class for the Chinese women on the campus has been organized with Mrs. Bessie Hsu as teacher. The class meets every Thursday morning at 10.

The new swimming pool, 36 x 60 ft., has been completed and will be ready for use in about a month. At present, the water is being run in slowly to higher levels to test for leakage. If money is available next year, dressing-rooms and other fixtures will be built. The committee wishes to make special acknowledgement of the services of Mr. Y.C.Lin, who designed and supervised the work, to Prof. F.C.Martin for advice and aid in supervision, and to Mr. H. S. Yang for the cooperation of the business management in many ways.

The Chemistry Society has planned to give a series of six lectures on Industries in Fukien during this semester. These lectures will be given bi-weekly by students, details to be announced for each meeting.

The new social hall for which the Student Relations Committee has been making plans for sometime is now ready for use, and it will be formally opened on Monday evening, March 11, at 7:30 o'clock. A special program has been planned for the evening, and all students and faculty members are cordially invited to attend.

The women members of the S.C.A. will meet at the home of Dean and Mrs. Chen Friday, March 15, at 6:45, to discuss "The Problems of College Women". Mrs. T.H.E. Chen is the advisor of this group. The study is an outgrowth of the meeting of the Chinese Christian College Women's Federation which Miss Huang Siu Chi attended in Shanghai last January.

"The Exhibition Case" in the library will be devoted to a series of exhibits this semester, illustrating certain phases of the material culture of China from the Shang Dynasty down to the Sung. The first exhibit is called "The Bronze Age in China" and contains about 60 objects of bronze and a few of pottery illustrating the culture of Ancient China from about 1500 B.C. down to the end of the Former Han 25 A.D. Most of these objects came from Shou Chou in Anhui and Loyang in Honan and were secured by Mr. Farley on his recent trip to Shanghai.

The Health Department of the Nieu Tien station is organizing an Anti-Contagious Disease Campaign under the leadership of Dr. Chiu Shao Lin, as a preventative measure against the many contagious diseases during the summer months. Vaccination and inoculations will be offered to the people of Nieu Tien and surrounding villages.

We are looking forward to welcoming to our campus a number of visitors within the next few weeks:

- (1) Dr. Luther A. Wiegand, Dean of Yale University Divinity School, is in China for a visit of five or six months. He is scheduled to be in Foochow from March 15-20. Mr. Henry Lucy will have charge of his appointments in Foochow. Dr. Wiegand will spend Monday, March 18, at F.C.U.
- (2) Dr. Wynn C. Fairfield, Foreign Secretary of the American Board of Commissioners for Foreign Missions, with headquarters in Boston, U.S.A., will visit Foochow the first week in April, during which time he will visit F.C.U. Dr. Fairfield is the Chairman of the Fukien Board of Trustees.
- (3) Rev. F. T. Cartwright, a former Foochow missionary, and now Secretary of the Far East Division of the Methodist Board of Foreign Missions, with headquarters in New York City, will visit Foochow during the first part of April. Mr. Cartwright is a member of the Fukien Board of Trustees, and we are looking forward to a visit from him.
- (4) Dr. Anna Achison, Director of Children's Work in the Presbyterian Church, East Orange, New Jersey, U.S.A., will visit Foochow March 25 to April 3. Dr. Achison is an eloquent speaker, and she is especially interested in education and children's work. She will visit F.C.U. during her stay in Foochow.

O T H E R   N O T I C E S

Dr. Luther A. Weigle, Dean of the Divinity School of Yale University, is visiting China under the auspices of the National Christian Council with the purpose of studying the training of religious workers. He arrived at Foochow on March 15, and will visit the University on Monday, March 18, when he will speak in convocation and meet the Religious Activity Committee and the faculty.

The Hui Gie Village School, from which we withdrew last June in order to concentrate our efforts on Nieu Tien Village, has just been reorganized under the direction of Dean T.H.E. Chen, with Mr. John Tsao as teacher. The following is a brief message from Dean Chen concerning the school: "In many ways, the reorganization of the Hui Gie Village School marks the beginning of a new epoch in the village. Contrary to past practices, the village people have taken an active part, and in many instances the initial step, in every phase of the reorganization plan. For the first time, there has been organized a representative Board to assume full responsibility for the school. The school opened last Monday with a record-breaking enrolment of over 80 pupils, of whom nearly 20 are girls. The school works under two serious handicaps: (1) with only one teacher, and (2) with enough tables and chairs for only 60 pupils. The limited budget of the school provides for one full-time teacher only, and does not permit expenditures for more furniture. Families in the village have generously loaned benches for temporary use." Those interested in giving help in either time or money are asked to communicate with Dean Chen as soon as possible.

Dr. Y. T. Wu, head of the Editorial Department of the National Y.M.C.A., Shanghai, will come to Foochow the latter part of this month. Dr. Wu will be the chief speaker for the Student Conference of North Fukien, to be held at Sharp Peak, March 30 - April 3.

Dr. T. H. Cheng will lecture over the radio in Foochow Thursday evening, March 21, at 8:00 o'clock, on "The Nutrition of the Human Body with Suggestions as to the Selection of Foods and Possible Improvements of Daily Diet."

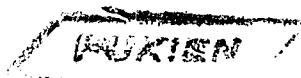

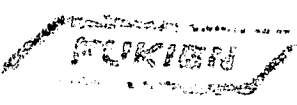

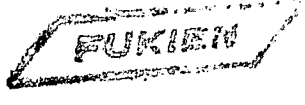

The spring meeting of the Alumni Executive Committee will be held next Saturday, April 20, at the Y.M.C.A. in Foochow.

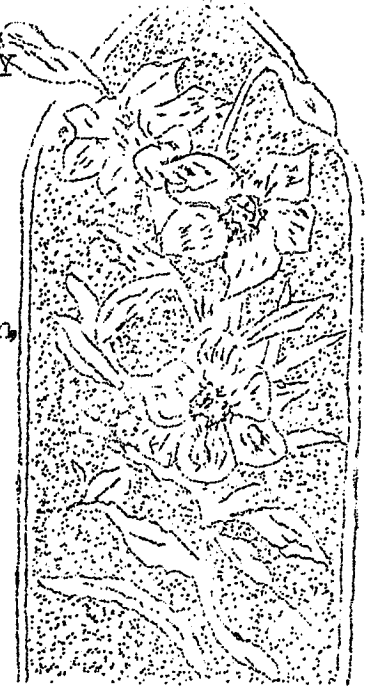
The Secretary's Office edited the third issue of the Fukien News in Chinese last week. This issue contains the full report to the government on our rural service work.

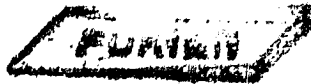

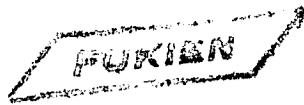
Dean T. H. E. Chen and Mr. Tan Jen Mei left on April 28 for Shanghai to attend the Conference on Secondary Education.

Teacher training is one of the major problems about which the Council is concerned. Effort is being made to get the colleges and middle schools to cooperate more closely in order to have better trained teachers for the middle schools. More and more in the future, the middle schools will demand of their teachers some minimum professional training in Education in addition to a good knowledge of subject matter.

The formal opening of the swimming pool, scheduled for last week, was postponed on account of the weather. It will be held next Wednesday, April 22, at 4:30 p.m. All swimmers are asked to go in the pool, and all others are invited to attend.

President and Mrs. C. J. Lin are planning to return to China by way of Europe, leaving New York on July 5 and arriving in Foochow early in Sept.

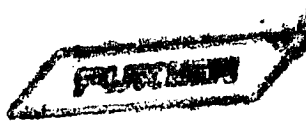

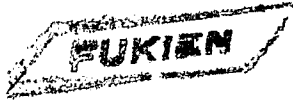

The period for change of courses ends on Saturday, September 21. No students, new or old, may register later than Wednesday, September 25.

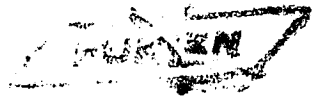

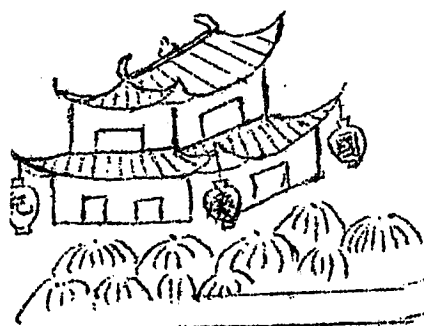

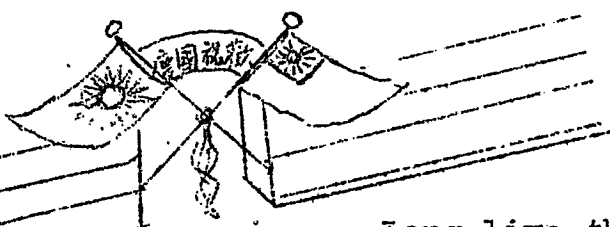

The Chemical Society will go on an excursion-picnic to Huang-Shih on October 10 for making a special study of the native industry of pottery making. Members and non-members are all welcome.

President C. J. Lin has been elected as one of the three delegates from Fukien Province to the first National Convention of the Association for the Cultural Reconstruction in China, to be held at Nanking this fall.

Dr. W. Y. Chen of our Psychology and Religion Departments is now in Peiping as the platform speaker of the Youth and Religion Movement in China sponsored by the National Y.M.C.A. During the following month he will visit centers in Shansi, Hupeh, and Hunan. Dr. Chen will spend a week in Foochow in the middle part of November for meetings, before going on to Amoy and Canton.

Dr. Francis Chen of our Rural Service Department has recently published a program for the improvement of the leading agricultural products of Fukien Province. This was done at the request of Commissioner Chen of the Public Works Bureau of Fukien. The program formulates practical outlines for the establishment of public experiment stations to deal with the four main products of the province; namely, rice, tea, lumber, and fruit.

An Educational film, "The Water and Life", was shown under the auspices of the Wu Li Ting Rural Service Department on the evening of the National Holiday, October 10. The film was furnished free of charge by the Science Institute, Foochow. About 1000 farmers were present.

Bishop and Mrs. John Gowdy have recently returned to Foochow after being away for some time in the interest of their work in other parts of China, including a trip to West China. They will visit President and Mrs. Lin Sunday, October 13. The F.C.U. faculty looks forward to welcoming them to our campus and to having a visit with them at President Lin's home Sunday evening at 8:00 o'clock.

Since the Fukien Government turned over to us the Rural Reconstruction Experiment Station at Wu Li Ting we have been pushing forward a program for the general improvement and uplift of the life of the villagers throughout the eleven villages. Some of the projects under way are:

- 1) Poultry raising; conducted on a modern basis with the coops in proper quarters so that the people can become acquainted with the methods used.
- 2) Hog raising; a good stock of hogs have been distributed to various families.
- 3) Better Farming; a model farm is being planned to show the farmers in a practical way how better seeds can be secured by the process of selection. This project cannot be started until the present crop is harvested and land is available for rent.
- 4) Rural Education; a Teachers' Society consisting of the teachers and the directors of the Mass Education Schools has been organized to promote rural education in the Wu Li Ting area. Club work among the pupils is conducted on the basis of the 4-H Clubs.

A small outdoor pottery furnace has been built by the Chemistry Department for experimental purposes. This will be tested for efficiency in various ways, and it may be remodeled if the tests made by the class indicate that an improved design is needed.

Friends will be interested in knowing what the F.C.U. graduates of June 1935 are doing. I report on a few below; others will be reported later as space permits:

Miss Chang Yu Ying; teaching Physics and Mathematics in the Middle School, Ginling College, Nanking.

Mr. Chou Yung Yao; Educational Inspector, Chang Loh District, Fukien.

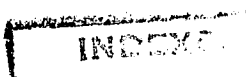
Mr. Huang Chan Shen; teaching Chinese in Hingwa.



Our Wu Li Ting Rural Reconstruction Station is experimenting in wheat-raising on the farms in the various villages, as much of the land is left idle after the fall rice crop is harvested. For this purpose, 750 pounds of wheat has been purchased by the Station and distributed to 75 farmers who are willing to try this new crop. Each farmer must return to the Station at harvest time the same amount of wheat that he received. More than 75 mou of land is now under cultivation in wheat crops.

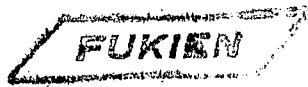
The Fukien Christian Educational Association is organizing a Religious Education Team to set up religious education meetings at Yenping, Kutien, Mintsing, Futsing, and Hinghwa. The purpose of these meetings is to help the teachers in the Christian schools to understand better the meaning of the Religious Education Program as passed by the Youth Workers Conference, and adopted by the Council of Secondary Education of the China Christian Educational Association last April. The members of the Team are: Mr. R. D. Rees of the Religious Education Department of the N.C.C., Shanghai; Mr. Tsai Chao Siu, Student Secretary of the National Y.M.C.A.; Miss Lin Yu Kuang, Student Secretary of the National Y.W.C.A.; Mr. S. S. Ding, General Secretary of Religious Education, M. E. Church in China; Mr. Lin Kuan Ping, Principal of Min I School, Futsing; and Mr. Tan Jen Mei, Secretary of the Fukien Christian Educational Association. The group will leave Foochow for Yenping on December 2, and will go to Kutien December 9, Mintsing December 11, returning to Foochow on December 14. Then they will go to Futsing on December 16, Hinghwa December 18, and meet with the Foochow teachers on December 21.
