Faculty and students are kindly requested to send in notices and news items for the Weekly Bulletin to Miss Asher, at the Treasurer's Office, before noon on Friday of each week.

We welcome to our campus two new faculty members, Miss Li Gwan Fang and Miss Eunice T. Thomas. Miss Li, Dean of Women, arrived on February 2. She will also give two courses in Sociology this semester. Miss Thomas arrived on January 19. She will give courses in English.

We also welcome to our campus Mrs. Li Chao Ming and her three children.

Dr. W. Y. Chen who was on a leave of absence last term, traveling with the Youth and Religion Team, returned to the campus on January 9.

Dean T.H.E. Chen returned to the campus on February 2 from a visit to Shanghai and Nanking. Dean Chen represented President Lin at the conference of Presidents, Principals, and Students called by General Chiang Kai Shek, in Nanking, January 15 - 18. Mr. Chen Yuan Kuang ('38) attended the conference as the student representative of F.C.U. The representatives were well satisfied with the results of the conference. Later, Dean Chen attended the meeting of the council of Higher Education in Shanghai, January 23 - 25.

Dr. Francis Chen went to Canton for the National Convention of the Adult Educational Association, January 18 - 23. After the convention he joined a special organized group to study the conditions in Kwangsi Province, well-known as one of the most progressive provinces in China at the present time. This special group was the guest of the Kwangsi Government. Dr. Chen is expected back in a few days.

Prof. C. R. Kellogg went, with three students, to Chuangchow and Changchow on January 31, at the special request of the Fukien Government to organize a campaign against the stink bugs of the litchi fruit, one of the chief products of the farmers in that region. The students accompanying him are Messrs. Huang Kuang Hua ('36), Tan Chih Kang ('37), and Wang Ching Chen ('37). Prof. Farley also went on the trip for work in connection with his archaeological studies. They are expected back today.

We are starting the spring semester on Monday, February 10, with a new educational program designed to meet the special needs of our college students in this time of national crisis. The whole curriculum has been reconstructed so as to more adequately fit our students to serve society and the people in the rural districts. Nearly a dozen new courses are being offered. Classes will be held on Saturday afternoons so as to make Thursday afternoons free for special field training and extension activities. About eight groups of special activities have been organized, and all students are required to register in some one of the groups. Each group is under the charge of two or three faculty members, and the whole Extension Program is coordinated under a general committee headed by Dr. W. Y. Chen. A Chinese Bulletin will be issued every two weeks. A series of special lectures has been planned for the weekly Convocations throughout the semester.

151 students have registered to date, 116 men and 35 women.

The first convocation of the semester was opened last Monday, February 10, by President Lin's remarks on the special significance of the opening of this term, as it marks the 20th anniversary of the founding of Fukien Christian University and the beginning of a year when China faces the most critical stage of her national life. He announced that the plans for the 20th Anniversary Celebration have been canceled, since the whole energy of our faculty and students, as well as our alumni, will be mobilized in an effort to strengthen our educational program so that it may serve the country more directly and more effectively at this critical period. The President announced the general principles on which the curriculum has been reconstructed, and called on Dean Chen to explain the new curriculum in detail; also W. Y. Chen to present the special Thursday afternoon extension activities, and Prof. T. H. Wang to announce the plans of the Student Relations Committee for the reorganization of the Student Self-Government Association. Immediately following convocation the four classes met separately and elected their representatives to form the Executive Committee of the Student Self-Government Association.

Thursday afternoon, February 13, was given over to registration for the Thursday afternoon extension activities, which are divided into the following groups: (1) Rural Service, (2) Physics Field Work, (3) Science Extension Teams, (4) First Aid, (5) Engineering Corps and Gardening, (6) Gas Defense.

The Student Relations Committee has made ~~arrangements~~ for a regular period every week, 10:00 - 10:30 on Thursdays, for meetings of the Student Self-Government Association, the four classes, and other student organizations.

The second issue of Fukien Culture for the year 1935-36 has just been published. It is a special number on Fukien Riddles. About 700 common riddles circulating verbally among the rural districts throughout the province have been collected by F.C.Y. students and are now published for the first time.

The first of a special series of books on Fukien Culture has been issued by the Committee on Chinese Studies: "A Short History of Changchow" by Yung Kuo Liang.

A few Chinese friends of F.C.U. in Shanghai have for the last year or two given a scholarship as an award to the best science student at the university. This scholarship for 1935-36 was recently awarded to Mr. Chiu Chi Shan, a Chemistry major (June '36).

Our Wu Li Ting Rural Reconstruction Station consisting of 12 villages has been divided into four sections for the purpose of training local leaders in each section. The training consists of elementary knowledge in agriculture, citizenship, rural economics, local government, etc. This training will be given for a period of three months, and certificates will be awarded to those who pass the examination.

The faculty have passed resolutions admitting special auditors to the university, beginning this term, for the purpose of accommodating pastors, social workers, and teachers who have been working for at least five years, but who, for one reason or another, are not qualified to enter as a regular student for the full college course. The conditions of entrance are as follows:

1. They must be responsible persons, well recommended.
2. They must apply for the privilege of admission to the Dean, and be admitted to such courses as they may profitably attend.
3. Auditors are exempt from the regular entrance examinations.
4. They shall abide by all the regular regulations of the university.
5. No credits nor certificate of any kind will be given, and auditors shall not be permitted to take final examinations.
6. They shall pay the following fees: \$1.00 per semester class hour up to 18 hours, and the usual room, light, key, medical, laboratory, and library fees.
7. They must take the usual physical examination at entrance.

We have with us this term Mr. Lin Chin I, a pastor from Ingtau, who is attending classes as an auditor.

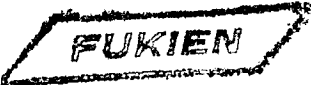
A large radio has been installed in our Wu Li Ting Rural Reconstruction Station. Radio schedules have been arranged for men, women, and children.

Miss Helen Caulder, a former Secretary of the American Board of Commissioners for Foreign Missions, Boston, Massachusetts, is visiting in Foochow. She will visit the F.C.U. campus on Sunday and Monday, March 8 and 9.

The spring meeting of the F.C.U. Board of Managers was held in Foochow this morning.

We are happy to note a marked improvement in the general tone of student life at F.C.U. this term. The students responded with enthusiasm to the plans for extension service, and all of the groups which carry on special extension activities every Thursday afternoon have met with success and faithful cooperation in their plans. The Student Self-Government Association, recently organized in conformity with the new regulations of the National Government, has won the confidence of the student body, and there is already noticeable a vast improvement in group life on the campus. The Association has worked out a budget for the semester, and among its plans are a series of athletic games among middle schools in Foochow, an athletic meet on the campus, movies and fellowship dinners for the community, a health and cleanliness campaign, in the dormitories in particular, and a night school for the workmen on the campus. Of the class organizations, the Sophomore Class deserves special mention. It has held several meetings, with Prof. Henry S. C. Chen as advisor, and has made plans for such commendable projects as debates, plays, etc.

Friends too far away from Foochow to see Kushan Peak will be interested to know that for the last week the Peak has been covered with a thin layer of snow, or perhaps it is ice by this time. A group of F.C.U. students went up yesterday to see snow and ice for the first time in their lives. They report that all of the trees are laden with ice. Late yesterday afternoon one of the students was carrying around in his pocket a small lump of ice carefully wrapped several times for safe-keeping! This will explain to friends abroad what a novelty snow and ice are in this part of China.

The Social Department of the Student Self-Government Association, of which Mr. Chang Hsien Cheng is in charge, plans to have social gatherings in the Social Room of the women's dormitory every Saturday evening, beginning tonight, March 14.

The Athletic Department of the Student Self-Government Association, of which Mr. Lin Cheng Yung is in charge, has approached the schools in Foochow for a series of tournaments in the following games:

1. Open to the public: Basket ball; tennis, singles and doubles, for men
2. Open to men students: Basket ball, volley ball, and soccer
3. Open to girl students: Basket ball and volley ball.

Application must be made to the Athletic Department of the F.C.U. Student Self-Government Association before March 18, and the tournaments will begin on March 21. F.C.U. silver cups will be awarded to the champions of each of the above groups.

Mr. Lin Tze Chuan, the Educational Secretary in our Wu Li Ting Rural Reconstruction Station, has been sent by the Fukien Government to investigate the rural educational program in the provinces of Chekiang and Kiangsu. Mr. Lin will make a special study of Prof. C. H. Tao's rural educational system.

Readers of the Bulletin will remember that during the winter vacation the Provincial Government and the Agricultural Extension Service of the University cooperated in a campaign to arouse interest in the destruction of the lychee stink bug, which is so injurious to the lychee fruit industry in Fukien Province. A recent letter from Mr. Lo Chen Hsia ('27), who is managing the campaign in Hinghwa, gives some interesting information concerning the work done there. The local committee secured a fund of \$100 from the Famine Relief Committee and used it to purchase the live, hibernating insects from the villagers, and in one small district near the city they secured 76,474 bugs! A second \$100 has been secured, and the work will continue. When it is realized that each overwintering female is capable of laying from 168 to 200 eggs in a year it can readily be seen that even this restricted effort will prevent some 6,329,816 potential stink bugs from injuring the lychee trees of Hinghwa this coming summer.

Preliminary announcement has been made by The New History Society of New York, 132 East 65th Street, New York City, that in June 1936, it will present a world competition on the subject "HOW CAN THE PEOPLE OF THE WORLD ACHIEVE UNIVERSAL DISARMAMENT?" to the inhabitants of the world, without regard to age, sex or educational qualifications. The total sum of U.S.\$5000 in prizes will be distributed. Those who wish to participate in the competition can secure application blanks and other information from Mr. H. P. Yang of the Secretary's Office, F.C.U. The New History Society was organized in 1929, and its principal aim is the establishment of an international integrated life between the people of the East and of the West.

Students and faculty are reminded that Dr. Li comes to the university on Tuesdays and Fridays, and those who are interested should plan to see him on these days during the next week or two.

Readers of the Bulletin will remember that Dr. Chen was the platform speaker of the Youth and Religion campaign last fall.

The Governor and the Commissioner expressed great satisfaction with the work which is being done at the stations and in the villages. The Governor authorized our rural service staff, headed by Dr. Francis Chen, to work out a practical housing plan for the villages. He is interested in building a few model village homes in one of these stations so that the villagers of this district may see them and introduce this type of house in their own villages. Readers of the Bulletin will remember that the work of our Wu Li Ting Station is financed entirely with funds from the Provincial Government.

Prof. R. Scott tried out the possibilities of Ingtai as a weekend spot, May 23-25, and found them excellent. He went up on Saturday in 13 hours and returned Monday in 10. While at Ingtai Prof. Scott was the guest of Dr. and Mrs. Beard and Rev. and Mrs. E. H. Smith. The Thursday Afternoon Rural Service Extension Group entertained on the campus last Thursday, June 4, a large number of the village people among whom they have been working this term. A group of women students under the leadership of Dean Li worked among the women of the surrounding villages. One of the projects was a "Better Home Contest" conducted in Kwei-Chi and Nieu Tien. Prizes for the best kept homes were awarded at the meeting held on the campus last Thursday, a mosquito net being the first prize for each village. Soap and towels were given to all who registered for the contest. Prizes were also awarded to the women who had done the best work in the mass education class, based on examinations.

A group of men students under the leadership of Mr. Chin Yun Min worked among the village boys and girls throughout the semester. A Mandrin Speech Contest was held at the meeting on Thursday by the boys and girls from sixteen villages (from Kwei-Chi to Wu Li Ting), for which prizes were awarded.

Dr. W. Y. Chen has been granted a two-year leave of absence by the Board of Managers of F.C.U., to take over the office of General Secretary of the National Christian Council of China, with headquarters in Shanghai, beginning July 1. The Council has been without a General Secretary for the last two years. It is now imperative that the Council has a strong leader to plan for the International Missionary Council which is to be held in China in 1938.

Miss Huang Siu Chi ('36) and Mr. Tan Jen Mei ('34) have been invited by the National Y.W.C.A. and Y.M.C.A., respectively, to join the China delegation to the World's Student Christian Federation to be held at Mills College, Oakland, California, August 23 - September 2. The China delegation consists of six people, three women and three men. Other than the Fukien delegates, there will be a young woman from Yenching and one from Ginling, and a young man from Lingnan, and a Y.M.C.A. Secretary. The delegation has been invited by the Japanese Y.M.C.A. to attend the Japanese Students Summer Conference, July 16-23. The group will leave Shanghai on the "President Coolidge" on July 14, and will leave Japan for America on the "President Lincoln" on August 4. After the conference in America, Miss Huang will return to China to take up her work with the National Y.W.C.A. as Student Secretary, and Mr. Tan will go on to Drew University for further study.

Dr. W. Y. Chen, Dr. Francis Chen, Dean Li, and fifteen student delegates from F.C.U. will attend the Summer Conference of the South China Colleges to be held at Amoy University, June 26 - July 3.

Miss Chen Jen Ying ('37) is the Chairman of the Summer Conference of the North Fukien Student Christian Union which will be held on the F.C.U. campus, August 26-31.

Prof. Edwin Chen will leave Shanghai on the "President Hoover", August 11, for Los Angeles. As announced previously, Prof. Chen has been awarded a fellowship for 1936/37 in the University of Southern California.

Dean Li Gwan Fang will spend a part of the summer vacation in Shanghai and Chinkiang.

Miss Asher will visit Swatow during the summer.

We are happy to welcome to our campus the following new faculty members: Mr. Lin Le Chuan of Foochow, Department of Agriculture; Mr. Sieh Sung Kuang, formerly of Chung San University, Botany; Mr. Huang Yu Shu, Rural Education; Mr. Lin Ching, ('33), Agriculture; Mr. Lin Chuan Kuang, College of Agriculture of the University of Nanking, Agriculture; Mr. Kao Tze En, Physics; Miss Chen Nien Hsuan ('36), Graduate Assistant in Chemistry; Mr. Hsiung Shu Kuo, Changsha, Hunan, Athletic Director; Mr. Lin Chao Wen ('30), Registrar and Instructor in Rural Sociology.

Prof. and Mrs. E. M. Stowe and family were due to arrive in Shanghai yesterday after a year of furlough in America, and we are expecting them to be on the campus in a few days. Prof. Stowe will resume his work in Education and Religion, and Mrs. Stowe will give some courses in English.

Two new departments have been established in the College of Rural Reconstruction: Department of Agriculture and Department of Rural Economics. The personnel in the departments are as follows: (1) Agriculture - Mr. Lin Le Chuan, Chairman of the department; Prof. C. R. Kellogg, in charge of teaching and experiment work in Entomology; Mr. Sieh Sung Kuang, Botany; Mr. Lin Ching, Research Assistant in Animal Husbandry; Mr. Lin Chuan Kuang, Research Assistant in Horticulture. (2) Rural Economics: - Prof. Francis Chen, Chairman of the department; Mr. Huang Yu Shu, Rural Education; Mr. Lin Chao Wen, Rural Sociology. These two departments have been recognized by the Ministry of Education, Nanking, and the Fukien Provincial Government has made a grant towards the current expenses. Mr. Guy Thelin of the Union Normal High School, Foochow, is Advisor for the work in soil, and Mr. W. W. Overholt of Yenping is Advisor for the work in Animal Husbandry.

The departmental work and the personnel of the Arts College have recently been reorganized to meet the needs of our new educational program, as follows: (1) Department of Chinese Literature and History, (2) Department of Western Languages, Literature, and Philosophy, (3) Department of Education and Psychology. The Department of History and Sociology has been combined with the Chinese Department and the Rural Economics Department, respectively. Dean T. H. E. Chen has been appointed Chairman of the Arts faculty, Prof. R. Scott Chairman of the Department of Western Languages, Literature, and Philosophy, and Prof. Lin Hsi Chien as Secretary of the University.

Registration took place on September 9, 10, and 11. To date 160 students have registered, 40 girls and 120 boys.

The period for change of courses ends on Saturday, September 19. No students, new or old, may register later than Wednesday, September 23.

The Dean's Office reports a total enrolment of 175 students, including six unclassified students taking special courses. The office also reports that the number of applicants for admission this year breaks all past records. The total number of applicants was 153, of whom 144 actually took the entrance examinations. We have admitted 63 new students, 59 in the freshmen class and four transferred from other colleges. Of the total enrolment 44 are women.

School teams of various kinds of athletic sports are being organized by our new Athletic Director, Mr. Hsiung Shu Kuo. Those who wish to take part should register at Mr. Hsiung's office before Wednesday, September 30. Teams are being organized for women as well as for men.

Governor Chen recently sent his representative, Dr. T. H. Lu, to visit our Rural Service Station at Wu Li Ting. After inspecting our work there, he suggested further cooperation on the part of the government in the Public Health Service. The Provincial Government will send two full-time resident public health workers. Three clinic centers will be opened. Among other things the program will include disease prevention, registration of births and deaths, etc.

Readers of the Bulletin will remember that the Foochow Union Hospital has sent two nurses one day a week for the last two years, and this last year a doctor, for public health work in our Station. The hospital is continuing this most worthwhile service this year.

The "Marketing" class under Dr. Francis Chen will visit the Agricultural Cooperative Marketing Union at Tai Ting (Foochow) today so as to see the actual process of cooperative marketing of agricultural products.

We are expecting Mr. Chu Hsuing, our new Horticulturist, to arrive by "Tsinan" from Shanghai tomorrow. Mr. Chu took his undergraduate work in agriculture at the University of Nanking, where he served on the staff for two years after his graduation. Then he went to America for his postgraduate work, first to the University of California, and later to the Oregon State Agricultural College where he received his Master's degree. Mr. Chu specialized in horticultural manufacturing. The Fukien Government has already asked F.C.U. for his services in connection with the work the government is doing in the improvement of citrus fruit in this province.

All friends of the university will be glad to know that Bishop and Mrs. John Gowdy are now back in Foochow after being away for about ten months, during which time they made a trip to West China, America, and Scotland.

Mr. F. C. Martin, formerly of F.C.U., has recently accepted a position as Professor of Physics in the University of Yunnan, Yunnanfu, Yunnan.

The Student Self-Government Association held a welcome meeting to new students and faculty members last evening, October 2.

Representatives from three adjacent villages called recently at our Wu Li Ting Rural Service Station and requested that we extend to their villages our social, educational, agricultural, and public health program. These villages had sent petitions to this effect several times in the past. The Station was somewhat slow in responding because the grant from the Provincial Government included only twelve villages in that territory. Now that these three villages have been included the Station is serving fifteen villages. Mothers Clubs have been organized and are carried on by three nurses from the Provincial Nurses Training School. Baby care and home improvement are especially emphasized.

The Fukien Government is planning to establish a Horticultural Experiment Station in cooperation with the Department of Agriculture at F.C.U. Special attention will be given to the improvement of citrus fruits and a few important vegetables.

The Fukien Branch of the National Association for Economic Reconstruction in China held its first meeting in Foochow last Thursday, October 1. President Lin, Profs. Lin Le Chuan and Francis Chen are members of the Association. A concrete proposition for a better economic order for the people in this province, made by Prof. Francis Chen, was adopted by the Association.

Miss Virginia Kellogg, daughter of Prof. and Mrs. C. R. Kellogg, was married to Mr. Edward Hoadley of Bloomington, Indiana, on September 2. The wedding took place at the home of the groom. Mrs. Kellogg and son, Stanley, were present for the occasion.

Immediately after the wedding Mrs. Kellogg and Stanley returned to Los Angeles, where Stanley is now in school.

The Foochow Athletic Meet has been postponed until Monday, November 9. The finals for ball games will not take place until after the Athletic Meet which closes on November 11. Fearing that participation in the Athletic Meet may interfere with the excursions now being planned by the Self-Government Association and other organizations, we have decided to begin our autumn holidays today, November 7, asking all student organizations to plan, if possible, to move up the time of their trips so that they may not interfere with the Athletic Meet.

Many types of activities have been planned for the Autumn Holidays. Among them are:

1. A one-day trip to Sharp Peak under the auspices of the Self-Government Association
2. A collecting trip to Sharp Peak by the Natural History Society, November 7 - 9.
3. Visitation of schools in Foochow by the Education Club
4. Visit to the irrigation plant near Diong Loh by the Chemistry Club.
5. Visitation of schools with particular attention to classes in Chinese by students of the Chinese Department.
6. Faculty and Staff excursion to Huang Sioh to visit the pottery works there.

Among the activities of the student clubs this year, different forms of community service occupy a prominent place. The night school for workmen on the campus under the Student Christian Association was reported in a previous Bulletin. Five men students and five women students have offered regular voluntary service for this undertaking, giving an hour or more every week. The Student Christian Association also conducts a Sunday School at Hui Gie Village with four classes enlisting more than 40 children. The program consists of Bible stories, games, and some manual work. Another project worthy of mention is the joint undertaking of the Rural Service Club and the Education Club at A-Gie Village. There is as yet no modern elementary school in the village, and the members of these two clubs are cooperating in conducting regular daily classes for the children and projects in adult education such as public amusements, health movement, newspapers in simple language, etc. The women students have organized visiting teams to go to the village families in a campaign to improve family conditions.

Ten pigs of improved native stock have been selected and sent to ten families in villages under our Rural Experiment Stations for breeding purposes. The farmers are very glad to get the improved stock because they have found it more profitable.

Each farmer borrows 8 lbs. of seed wheat from the Station and the same amount is to be returned to the station when the crop is harvested.

1. Publication of a Handbook of Fukien (to be published in Chinese) including chapters on History, Geography, Government, Education, Public Works, Industries, Trade, Finance, Religions, Social Customs, etc.

3. Expeditions to Kutien, Mintsing, Yu-Ki

The first meeting of the Faculty Current Events Discussion Group for this term was held last night in the agricultural building where the group had dinner together. Prof. Lin Hsi Chien and Mr. Chin Yun Min are in charge of these meetings.

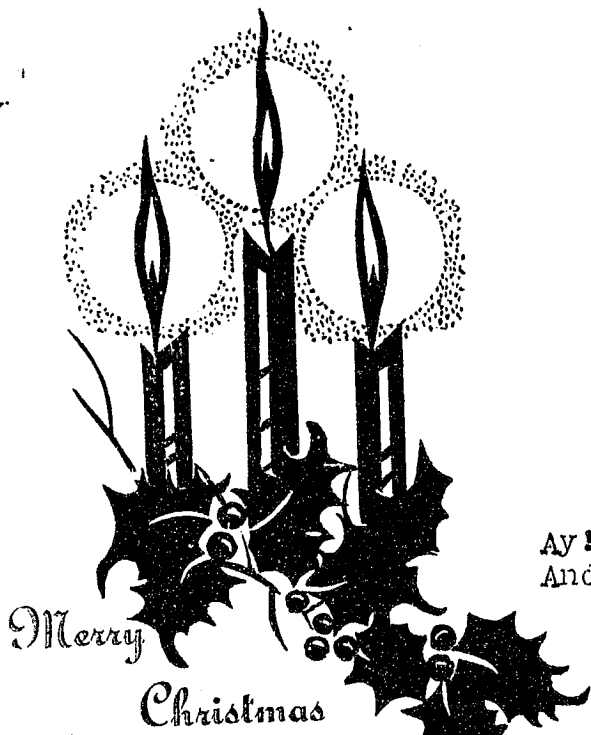

Prof. Lin Hsi Chien, Dean T.H.E. Chen, and Dean Gwan Fang Li have been asked to serve as the judges.

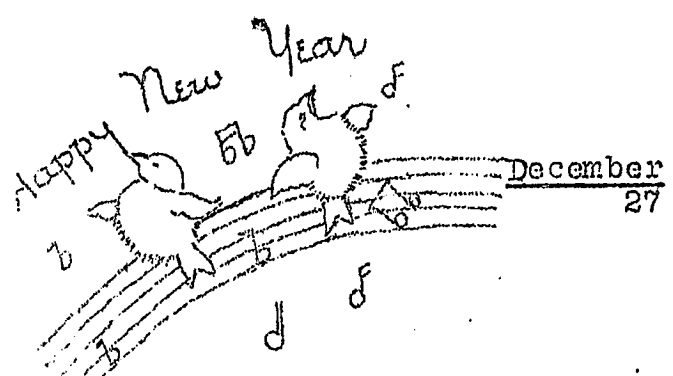

The campus is full of joy over the happy news received last night of the release of General Chiang Kai Shek. Foochow is putting on a city-wide celebration today in which our students will participate. A celebration meeting will be held this morning and a lantern parade this evening.

Bishop John Gowdy of the Methodist Mission, Foochow, has recently appointed Mr. William V. Overholt, formerly of Yenping, to help in our agricultural program at the university. Mr. Overholt is specialized in the field of Animal Husbandry, and he will start that work in our Agricultural Experiment Station on the campus. Mr. Overholt and his family are living in the Methodist Mission, Foochow.

Mr. Chu Hsiung and Mr. Lin Chuan Kuan of the Agriculture Department were sent to South Fukien recently by the Bureau of Public Works and our College of Rural Reconstruction to investigate the present conditions and methods of cultivating citrus fruits in that region. They spent about one week there, and brought back more than 400 plants for our Horticultural Experiment Station.

The Physics-Math Society held a meeting last Thursday evening at which time officers for next term were elected, as follows: Mr. Fu Tze Chen, Chairman, and Mr. Wang Mei, Secretary.

In past years the children of the villages in which we have been working were invited to our campus for their Christmas celebration. This year the celebrations were held in our rural centers so that the parents could also enter into the Christmas spirit. The celebrations were held yesterday. The Christmas plays given by the girls were directed by Miss Pan Chu Chin and Miss Chen Jen Ying, and the boys' play by Mr. Chen Lin Tsang.

The Fukien Branch of the National Economic Reconstruction Association has asked our Department of Rural Economics to draft the constitution of the Cooperative Reserve System for Fukien Province. This has been done and presented to the Association. If the constitution is passed it will be the first Cooperative Reserve System in Fukien.

The Provincial Health Department is cooperating with both of our Rural Experiment Stations in an effort to improve the housing conditions in the villages. The Public Health Inspector made an inspection including a number of families. The Public Health Department is supplying the necessary lumber and glass to provide for windows, leaving the planning and management of same to our Stations.
