Butler, Registrar Western College for Women Oxford, Ohio Dear Miss Butler: Thank you for your letter of January 10th, asking for information about Dr. Djang Hsiang-lan, Dean of Ginling. I am sorry to say that our files are rather scanty in the material they offer about Dr. Djang. Like most of our Chinese women, she is very modest and has done little to supplement this lack. I therefore have only these few facts to offer you. Diang Hsiang-lan (Helen Djang) graduated from Ginling College in 1928. From 1928-1936, she served in three Mission Schools, the last of which was Ming Deh Girls School in Nanking. She was the Principal of this School. She came to America in 1936, and in 1937 she was awarded an M.A. degree in Education by Colorado State College, Greeley, Colorado. In the fall of 1937, she entered the Graduate School of Northwestern University, Evanston, Ill., as a candidate for a Doctorate in Education. She studied at Garrett Institute in 1938. She was awarded the degree of Doctor of Philosophy by Northwestern University in 1939 and returned to China in January 1940. She went out to Chengtu to join the faculty of Ginling College as Dean of Students, and has held that position ever since. She is now in America, doing some study and part-time teaching at Mary Baldwin College, Staunton, Va. I hope that this information will serve your purposes. Sincerely yours, Mrs. W.
