My dear Mr. Carter:

Your letter of December 6th at hand and I am deeply puzzled over the contents of same and am wondering if you for one moment think that intentionally I have been withholding any information regarding Ginling or any of the returns from the campaign.

As regards the \$25,000 which I mentioned in my telegram, I only mentioned it because of the \$9,000 paid in on same. I have no bonafide pledge for that sum on my books, but mentioned it so as to guard the \$9,000 in case you were distributing any of the funds held here, as I felt you should know any particular designation. Miss Hodge knows perhaps more about this \$25,000 dormitory than do I, as I understand from Miss Mead that she has communicated with Mr. Ging and I am not sure now from the last letter received as to whether he intends to pay the balance or what arrangement he is planning. Mrs. Montgomery and Mrs. Feabody originally secured this promise. He is a very elderly man and is shut in from the outside world, and so of course has little else to think about and can easily be disturbed if things are not made very clear to him. I can give you no further information regarding that and am only hoping that with so many communicating with him he will still carry out his original purpose and meet the full payment. I have written him to ascertain his final arrangements.

Please believe, Mr. Carter, that it is my deepest purpose to do everything in behalf of this campaign for the Joint Committee and for yourself as Treasurer, and the only reason that I seemingly perhaps do not give you information is because I have no definite information to give, and as expert accountant I have never reckoned in to my accounting anything but that which is in shape for legal collections.

I am paying Tower Bros. stationery bill and trust that this letter is fully explanatory.

My dear Mr. Carter:

I have just had opportunity after the Campaign rush to take up carefully the matter in your letter of the 11th ult.

You state that my wire of December 5th advised you that the net balance to the credit of Ginling College was \$23,000. and that you sent under date of December 4th \$20,000, monies received that day from the Methodist Board." I received that \$20,000 Dec. 5th and I sent that back to you immediately on the same day, Dec. 5th. When you requested a wire, of course that had already been credited and charged to Ginling College so naturally I would not include it in my wire, having already sent it to you.

You then go on in your letter enumerating several amounts as having sent me on December 30th and January 3d. These were received and credited to Ginling College. On January 8th I sent you a check for \$15,637.45 which you state does not tally with what you report as previously sent me together with my wire. I think you have forgotten to take into consideration the 50% on the \$15,000 you included in your certification to the Rockefeller Trustees by error and which I, of course, eliminated from any credits reported for Ginling College, as Ginling had been overpaid that amount.

However, I am now enclosing herein a check to your order for \$8,911.06. This does not take care of that \$7,500 due the Treassury, but includes to date every individual designated gift on my books up to February 1st for Ginling College. It is perhaps as well to adjust the \$7,500 in our final payments to you. I wish you had straightened the matter out before turning the books over to me as it would have been much easier, you being more familiar

with the accounts under your own administration.

Will you kindly send me a list (taken from your reports which you turned over to me and of which you have the original copies) of all amounts paid to the various colleges under each college head so that in making my final payments I may know how much of the stipulated sum appropriated each college has been paid by you. I am asking this because of your familiarity with your own work and because of the fact that in your report to me are several reports of distributions and certifications which may not necessarily mean actual payments to the colleges and I want to receive from you the clear, definite statement of your payments to the colleges from the beginning of the Campaign up to the time you turned the books over to me.

I would like also if you can give it to me placed against the payments the receipts for the colleges, as in that balance of \$19,981.34 which you sent me are probably designated amounts for the colleges not yet paid over to them and which I have held until such time as adjustment of the balance is called for, which time seems now to have arrived.

Included in this check and the previous one are all the amounts received for the Laing Dormitory at Ginling College, their payments to date aggregating \$11,000.00 on a \$25,000.00 pledge.

Will you send me your official receipts in duplicate as Treasurer of Ginling College reading as follows:

Dear Mrs. Thurston:

Miss Bender and Miss Hodge and I have been at a loss to know whether the conditions of Mr. W.F. Laing's proposed gift of \$25,000. for a dormitory at Ginling are being met in one of the dormitories now erected or in the fourth dormitory authorized lately by cable.

We have tried repeatedly to secure from Miss Olsen and Mrs. Peabody the terms of his gift but have never been able to do so. We therefore have not known whether the \$11,000. now paid by Miss Olsen to me as Treasurer of Ginling is applicable on the expenditures which we are now making on either the original six buildings or on the dormitory subsequently approved. A letter just received from Mrs. Peabody reads as follows:

"I have several times explained that Mr.W.F. Laing wished his \$25,000. to apply on the dormitory in Ginling College. He was very specific regarding the location of the dormitory according to the plan which I submitted to him. I told Mrs. Thurston about this some months ago. sending a copy of his letter asking that he might have that particular building. It is to be a memorial to his Mother. He is giving the money. His sister is his trustee and will see that the entire amount is paid. He has already given \$11,000. and is preparing to release certain mortgages and pay the other \$14,000.within a short time."

None of us have had any word from Mr. Laing. We have heard rumors of the conditions which he has felt it necessary to lay down, and yet we have seen nothing in writing or in any official way, and the Ginling Committee is anxious to learn anything that you may know that will help us in this question.

My dear Mr. Carter:-

Your letter of Nov. 21, 1923, in the matter of the Hutchinson Memorial at Ginling College, reached me this morning. The question of the Hutchinson Memorial has been before us for several years. Its relation to our Society was complicated by the fact that the Hutchinson family was making the contribution through the Centennary, gifts from which go to the Board of Foreign Missions and not to the Joman's Foreign Missionary Society. The \$\frac{1}{4}640\$ I sent you June 2, 1922, was a part of this gift, and with the \$\frac{1}{2}010\$ sent by Dr. North recently, makes a total of \$\frac{1}{6}6650\$ for this particular purpose. Our original hope had been that about \$\frac{1}{2}000\$ would come in from the Hutchinson family. Whether more will come or not, I do not know.

We have had several different actions on our minutes in this connection, varying with the conditions of the Union College Campaign, and of the probabilities of the size of the gift itself. The latest which I find, and the one governing present conditions, reads:

"It was voted that if Ginling College will give to the Society the privilege of naming a room, it shall bear the name of "Hutchinson". "

In other words, the Hutchinson Memorial should be a large room of some sort in one of the Ginling College buildings. This matter is really in the hands of Miss Bender, as our representative on the Ginling College Committee, and I have assumed that she was taking it up with the authorities on the field. I should appreciate your bringing the matter to her attention, that a final conclusion may be reached as to the room and the naming of it.

Dear Mr. Carter:




