My dear Mrs. De Graff:

I have just had the great joy of receiving as treasurer of Ginling College your most generous gift of \$1000 for the new buildings at Ginling. Your check was received through Mrs. Frederick G. Mead. I know how you have delighted these good supporters of Ginling by your gift and I know that it will bring much enheartenment to those who are now working in the United States in behalf of the College, and those who are doing the work on the field in cramped quarters, with the building project somewhat indefinitely postponed. It does seem a pity with plans so carefully drawn, and with the need so urgent as it is, that there has been any delay in building. Our good ladies, however, are determined that the failure of the Interchurch Movement shall not indefinitely postpone this building and are taking such immediate steps to secure funds for these Union Women Colleges, as I am sure will bring to them very considerable success.

My dear Mrs. Thurston:

We have received from the Rockefeller Foundation the China Medical Board's appropriation of \$5,000. covering purchase of scientific equipment for Ginling, and enclose herewith draft to the order of the Ginling College Board of Control in this amount. We hope to receive shortly their check for the salary of the teacher in the Physics Department.

I have not been able to find by looking thru the correspondence that this should be held in New York against bills to be contracted for equipment. I notice on the report of 1920 (Treasurer's Report) that we paid three bills to the Central Scientific Co. totaling \$1,233.47, these, of course, having been charged out to the field. So perhaps we are correct in forwarding this \$5,000. to you at this time.


