Dear Mr. Fowler:

I am replying to a letter from Dr. Francis C. M. Wei, of Hua Chung University, relating to a candidate for a position on the faculty of this Institution from our denomination.

I assume that you are familiar with the experimental arrangement into which we entered during the past year with the University for financial support and the furnishing of a member of the teaching staff. Dr. Vernon L. Farnham, the Superintendent of our Hunan Mission, sent me a copy of Dr. Wei's letter earlier and I replied by saying there was no possibility at the present time of a candidate for the faculty being provided by our Board of Missions for the fall term. It will be necessary, first of all, for us to secure a person qualified to teach German and French. It will then be necessary to give him language study opportunity. We do not have a sufficient number of missionaries on our staff at the present time to attempt to allocate one for this work.

We are very much interested in this plan of participation in Hua Chung University, but we were aware when we entered into this arrangement that it might be some time before we could place a member on the faculty. We are grateful for the overture which Dr. Wei has made but will have to wait until the time when we are able to respond with a missionary candidate who can qualify for this important position. We are hoping to secure such a person and, when he is available, we will send further word.

Since Dr. Wei indicated that this letter might be addressed to you instead of sending it to him in China, I am doing so with the hope that you will communicate its contents to him as you deem advisable.
