



A TRIBUTE TO MY LATE HUSBAND

N these three days of my deep mourning for my most esteemed and beloved husband, I can hardly collect myself to write even a sentence. Yet my grief compels me to express something of my inner-most feeling at this moment.

On February 23rd, 1924, we were united for one great cause—, to render better service to humanity and to set out together for a higher purpose in life. During these thirteen years many physical relapses of his and mine, many disappointments and discouragements in facing our life's great task, many a storm and stress in overcoming my husband's physical handicaps, have knit us closer into a deeper spiritual bond and made us live close to each other. We could almost read each others' minds. He often remarked, "No one on earth understands me better than you do in my strivings for a higher goal." He confided in me everything about his medical work, the difficulties of starting the organization of this Orthopedic Surgery, and how he had to operate with a non-specialized team in a poorly equipped building.

During a period of six years, his contact with 5,600 cases revealed his indomitable courage in handling them. He never let a single opportunity slip for thinking out a better treatment for any patient. Each patient was his friend. The children loved him.

Since 1915 he had suffered from an ulcerated stomach, and in 1924, five days after our wedding, he was operated on for a perforated stomach. This imposed upon him the everlasting ban of a limited and tasteless diet which continually tortured him. He had to read newspapers to forget what he was eating. But the last seven months was the hardest and the greatest trial of all.

In 1934 when he was struck down with diphtheria, followed later by chronic nephritis I can never forget the agony and shock he went through. One day, he did not speak until late in the evening when he said: "My dear, your life will be a sacrifice from now on. I shall die a slow death. There will be even a harder fight than what we have been through—diseased kidneys and a depressed mind. I am physically crippled." Then he sobbed like a helpless child. I promised that I would stand by him and suffer with him. He said, "I am compelled to lay down my sword —the surgeon's knife." Then he looked at his trembling hands-"This pair of hands, of what use are they? I am now on the Altar." He loved his orthopedic surgery as an engineer does his machinery. A poor boy's finger or a worker's hand meant so much to him. He did everything for a laborer's son to save his middle finger from amputation. He kept the boy one and a half years, fed him, clothed the boy and educated him. Finally, he healed that finger and returned the boy to his laborer-father with pride, "Now you go back with a perfect hand." Then he told his staff, "How

much workers depend upon their hands. You must save unnecessary amputation or chopping off." But his own hands, trained and skilled, sensitive to the slightest difference of bone derangement, are sacrificed on the Altar!

Then the next day he saw a new vision, "I know what I'll do. I'll devote my whole energy to the Chinese Medical Association. It needs stabilizing and strengthening forces. It's a piece of work nobody cares for but full of vast potentialities for the health of our country. I'll try to put it on the right track." So I promised that we would change our line of attack and fight for a better and more united Medical Association. For the last three years that organization has been the central object of his devotion. Again he grieved for not having found his successors. So he watched and observed until he found greatest satisfaction in three colleagues, Drs. H. P. Chu, Szeming Sze, and W. S. Fu. He spoke of them as his jewels, "They are my gems, pearl, ruby and diamond." With these three to carry on his work, my husband said that he could die in peace feeling that the Medical Association was on the safe road to a higher level as he knew that these colleagues stood for the same ideals as his own for the work he had loved so much. Even on the day before his farewell to us when he was almost delirious—he talked to his immediate colleagues, commending the work of the Association to them.

Here, I would like to pay a tribute to the brave team of Doctors who had made it possible for him to enjoy the last Medical Conference the climax of his life's happiness. His spirit had never soared so high as it did then since his collapse. On March 28, he wrote his Will and on April 1st he marched into the Conference with a victorious spirit, dauntless and full of enthusiasm, and on May 4th he entered in to rest.

I would like to express my tearful gratitude to Drs. H. H. Morris, W. S. Fu, P. C. Tung and their wives who stood by us in the last seven months. They acted like brave warriors, realizing it was fatal yet keeping on the battle with the spartan spirit. Sixteen blood transfusions were made from my late husband's own friends.

Drs. W. S. Fu, Szeming Sze, T. A. Li, L. S. Woo, C.. Y. Chen, four medical students of the National Medical College Mr. W. K. Chen and three Marine Friends.

Thirty-two other friends and relatives volunteered and had their blood examined and typed.

It was a hard struggle for a suffering doctor with an incurable disease. But oh, what magnificent love and sympathy were shown to him until the very last. When Dr. Fu gave his blood for the 2nd time, he was much moved, "I don't deserve such treatment, why bother?"

For myself, these brave doctors gave me staying power to share my husband's agony until he joined our Heavenly Father whose Love and Mercy have no bounds.

Another source of power has been the sympathetic support of my relatives and friends with their constant loving remembrances of us in our times of trial and tribulation.

But the main spring of our strength comes from the Divine Power who controls the whole Universe and always has a deeper meaning for us to seek after. The lease of life He had given to my beloved husband was, indeed, well-used.

I wish to close with this passage from Dr. Fosdick's book, "The Power to see it through."—a book which has helped me much these days. "What is the most lamentable tragedy in human life? To face suffering, to be cruelly handicapped; Surely not! For we have seen some terribly handicapped people who had such moral staying power that they came through to a great conclusion, all their flags flying when they came into port."

Way Sung has always been so kind, thoughtful, and unselfish in his dealings with all with whom he had come into contact that his memory will live long in our hearts. His selfless ideals of service, and his indomitable courage to stand up for principles have already left their mark in the medical history of China, and as time goes on, I feel sure that we shall feel his sacrifices have not been in vain.







June 30, 1955

Dear Johannean:

Another year has been added to the history of our Alumni Association, here in New York, and once again it is time to review what has happened to the Association in the past twelve months.

AMENDMENTS TO THE CONSTITUTION

At the very first cabinet meeting, the members of the Executive Committee discovered that certain parts of our Constitution were obsolete and needed revision. After a careful study, the Executive Committee proposed a few amendments and, in the General Meeting of November 26, 1954, a motion to adopt the Constitution as amended was made, seconded, and unanimously carried. Later on, this amended Constitution was ratified by mail by a majority of members. Among these amendments were two major changes, namely, (1) the Nomination Committee for nominating officers is to be appointed by the Executive Committee rather than elected by the members, and (2) the one-year term of office of all officers is to begin on July 1st and end on June 30th of the following year instead of duplicating the calendar year.

THE DIAMOND JUBILEE

In keeping with a quality-rather-than-quantity policy, the Executive Committee decided to hold just two General Meetings within its tenure of office. The first such meeting took place in the evening of November 26, 1954 at St. Peter's Lutheran Church of Manhattan, New York City. The program was specially arranged to celebrate the Diamond Jubilee of our Alma Mater and highlighted by a warm greeting and speech by the Rev. William Z. L. Sung, our former President of the University. About 80 alumni and their families and friends came to attend. The interesting, original skits, the delicious refreshments plus a huge birthday cake, the reminiscent singing of our "Light & Truth", and the endless chatting among all made the evening a memorable occasion for everyone.

THE ANNUAL MAY OUTING

At 9:30 a.m., Sunday, May 22, 1955, more than 160 alumni and their families and friends took a boat ride up the scenic Hudson River to Indian Point Park, America's largest picnic-recreation-amusement park. Obliging sunshine and beautiful landscape at the Park created a delightful picnicking mood while the substantial "box-luncheonrama" provided the necessary energy for a full afternoon of sports and amusements. The group returned to New York around 9 p.m. This was out Annual May Outing as well as our second General Meeting.

DIRECTORY SUPPLEMENTS

Because of financial limitations, the Directory of St. John's University Alumni Association (in the United States) has not been completely revised in the past year. Instead, two Supplements to the Directory were compiled. The first one was distributed in November, 1954 and the second one is herewith enclosed.

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
