My dear Miss Buchers

We have received a letter from Miss Elsie M. Priest, Field Treasurer of the University of Manking, with which she enclosed a copy of the Short Term Agreement entered into between the University of Manking and yourself under date of June 5, 1952. Miss Priest enclosed Clergy Certificate applications which we have forwarded for you. I hope that these certificates have now reached you.

Miss Priest requests that we send you immediately a check for \$120 covering salary for one-half of the montheof June and all of July, at the rate of G. \$80 per month. I am enclosing herewith a check for this amount.

My dear Miss Bucher:

I have your letter of February 25rd, in which you ask for our form for the more extended contracts entered into between the University of Manking and its appointees.

I am enclosing herewith a copy of the form of contract we are now using, which provides for a term of five years on the field, followed by a furlough of one year. The contract is subject to renewal for one or more subsequent terms on the field of six years each, or may be converted into a life agreement.

I am also enclosing a form for a life agreement, which is provided for in our latest revision of Manking Schedule of Salary and Allowances, but has not as yet been used by any member of the University-supported Western staff. As a matter of fact, I believe that none of the present staff have had occasion to renew their existing contracts since this schedule was adopted in the Fall of 1951. It is possible, therefore, that at some points the phraseology of this life agreement might be slightly modified by either the officers or committees of the Board of Founders, or by the administrative officers on the field.

I am enclosing also for your information a copy of our latest revision of the Manking Schedule of Salaries and Allowances.

Personally, I feel that it would be a more satisfactory arrangement with members of the University-supported Western Staff who plan to remain permanently at the University, to have them enter into life agreements rather than contracts for five or six years. This would probably give both the appointee and the University more of an expectation of continuity of service, with no thought of termination, so long as all parties are satisfied and financial support is available.

We will be happy to proceed with the renewal of your contract along either of these two lines, as you, and Mr. and Mrs. Buck may prefer. We would also be glad to try to fit in any modifications in either form of contract that you may wish to suggest. Since the contract is in the name

of the University of Manking, and since the instructions given when the contract was made last June cover only a one-year period, we will have to take up with the field, and possibly with the proper Committee of our Board of Founders, the formal approval of renewing the contract. The question also arises as to whether the new contract should be signed on behalf of the University, by President Chem on the field, or by the officers of the Board of Founders in America. I am quite sure, however, that everyone will heartily favor the continuation of this arrangement on any basis satisfactory to you and Mr. and Mrs. Buck.



My dear Miss Bucher:

I have your letter of December 23 reporting the fact that one of your checks on your account at the Irving Trust Company was returned, marked "insufficient funds".

I have checked with the bank and find that appearently all your salary payments have been received and correctly entered.

Beginning with the payment we made you in June, we have made salary payments to you as follows:

July 26 -	July and August

In addition, the bank shows a deposit of \$100,00 credited to your account on November 20. We do not know the source of this item but undoubtedly you will recognize it.

The bank shows that your check for \$20.65 was received on November 14, and again on November 16, and each time was returned, marked "insufficient funds", because at that date the balance in your account was only \$12,00

Had it come in a week later there would have been ample funds for your credit.

I have telephoned to Miss Haslam of John Day and Company, and have explained the matter. She is planning to redeposit the check within a short time.

You have probably seen reports in the American papers as to the tentative proposal for a "bankers' code" which would include very heavy charges against all accounts maintaining a minimum balance of

less than \$500.00. The final date for determining this code is now set as February 1. If the code is adopted in anything like the form now proposed, the charge for handling modest accounts like yours and mine would be around \$3.00 a month.

THIS AGREEMENT, entered into by and between the UNIVERSITY OF NANKING and adding Buckethis

That the UNIVERSITY OF NANKING hereby agree to and do enter into a life agreement with alime ducker whose home address is Malicon, blining for the position of acculary: it being understood that the appointee's service to the University shall normally continue until death, disability, or retirement, provided such continuance is mutually desired by the University and the appointee.

This agreement is made in accordance with the "Schedule of Salary and Allowances for University-supported Western Staff" as agreed to, and as may in future be agreed to, by the Board of Founders and by the Board of Directors of the University.

This agreement may be terminated at any time by either the University or the appointee, upon due notice in writing. If the termination is made at the initiative of the University, the University shall continue the appointee's salary for three months from the date of said termination, and shall provide full expenses to the home address of the appointee, by the most direct route. If the termination is at the request of the appointee, continuation of salary for three months shall be given only where the reasons for the appointee's resignation are acceptable to the University. Travel arrangements in case of resignation at the initiative of the appointee shall be in accordance with the provisions of the schedule of salary and allowances under "Incompleted Contracts".

It is further agreed by elaline Sucher that will give ter whole time and attention to the work for which is hereby employed, and that the will not engage in any outside occupation or activity for profit, except as may be agreed upon in conference with the President of the University of Nanking.

### EMPLOYMENT AGREEMENT

### SHORT TERM AGREEMENT



This AGREEMENT, entered into by and between the University of Manking and Adeline Bucher this 3 7 9 fewe 1932, WITHESETH:

That the UNIVERSITY OF NANKING hereby agrees to and does employ Adeline Busher for the position of secretary for Mr. and Mrs. J. L. Buck for the period of one year beginning June 16, 1932, on the following schedule of salary and allowances:

- 1. Salary at the rate of Gold \$80.00 per month beginning June 16, 1932.
- 2. Room Rent
- 3. Medical attention for sickness without charge. One-half dental and oculist bills when approved beforehand by the University medical officer.
- 4. Vacation from one month to six weeks during the year, but not to exceed six weeks in total. The time to be arranged with Mr. and Mrs. Buck.

Adeline Bucher hereby accepts the said employment and the foregoing terms and conditions and agrees that if for any reason she resigns the position before the completion of the contract no payment shall be made for travel expenses.

It is further agreed by Adeline Bucher that she will give her whole time and attention to the work for which she is hereby employed, and that she will not engage in any outside occupation or activity for profit, except as may be agreed upon in conference with the President of the University of Manking.

This agreement may be extended to a short term, regular term or life appointment.
