My dear Mr. Ganside,

Your letter of March 4 + the accompany-
ing clergy application for a western certificate to Mr. Y. W.
Chang have been forwarded to me yesterday. Enclosed you
will find my application, a list of members of faculty for the
College of Agriculture + Forestry of the University of Nanking (Fall, 1934),
+ \$2.00 postal order.

I have been served the University of
Nanking for six + half years. I was appointed as the associate
of the department of forestry of the University of Nanking in Feb.
1927, + joined the Nanking Forest Service in July 1928 + the
Nanking Forest Service in July 1929 as the junior forester.
Then I came back to the University of Nanking again +
have been served as the associate (the instructor, since
Sept. 1931) of the department of forestry + the registrar of the
rural leaders training school since Sept. 1930.

As my health was not strong enough last
spring, I was not sure whether I could come to the states or
not, so I could not apply the clergy fee certificate before I left
China. As to my personal references, please refer to either Mr.

3-16-36.

John H. Reiner of Agricultural Missions Foundation or Dr. W. C. Lowdermilk of U. S. Soil Conservation Service. They are both my former professors in the University of Maryland & are familiar with my conditions.

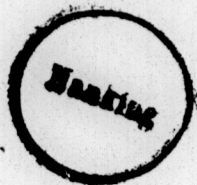
