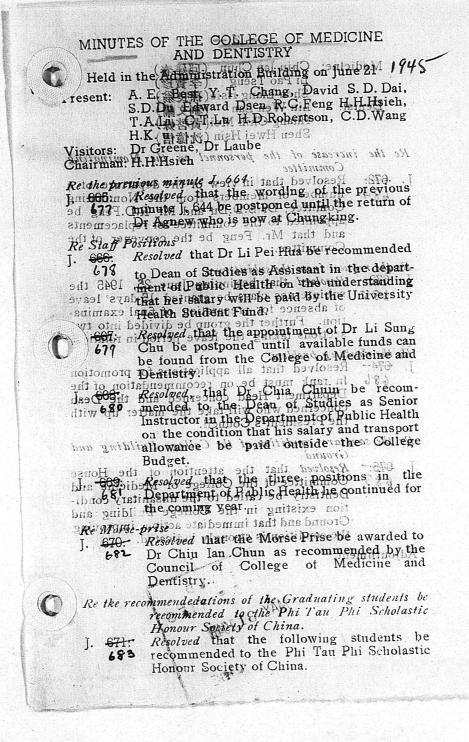

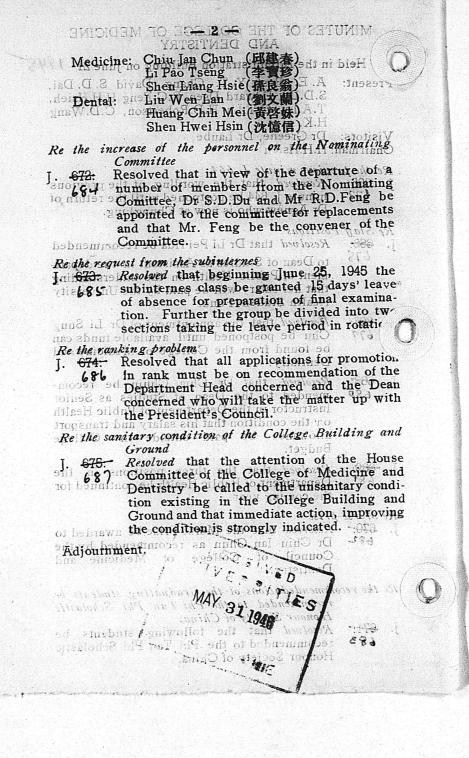

Internal medicine, inluding its various specialties such as tropical medicine, cardiology, hematology, tuberculosis, dermatology, gastroenterology, etc. Orthopedics; Anatomy, with which may be combined special interest in anthropology, histology, embryology; Clinical Pathology or Pathological Chemistry; Parasitology; Pharmacology; Hospital Administrator; Secretary-Stenographer (Several); Physiotherapy; Social Service; Oral Diagnosis, Odontal Surgery and Technology (Operative Dentistry) Oral Physiology and Oral applied Anatomy; Dental Nursing.

In addition, in view of the early opening of nursing education in the university the following list of nursing needs is presented to the Woman's College for appeal to the Mission's with the request that immediate appointment be made wherever possible. As many as possible of the nurses appointed should have college degrees. The following are some of the most urgent needs:

(D) Resolved: that we request the president to secure the services of a suitable person as soon as possible to be dean of the faculty or division of nursing, in order to head up this work.

(E) Resolved: to ask the W.C.U.U. to request the Women's College Board to appeal to their supporting Missions to appoint nurses qualified for university work to the faculty and also nurses for hospital work in the University hospital as soon as possible, (See J-723).

J-728 Request to Baptist Mission for the Use of the Middle School Dormitory.

Resolved: that the Director be asked to request permission for the use of the Baptist Middle School Dormitory for nurses and to appeal to the Canadian War Relief Fund for financial assistance to complete the building and to erect a new Middle School Dormitory for the Baptist Mission in exchange for the present building.

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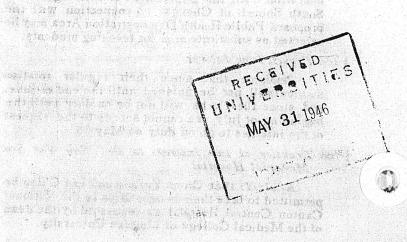
