We have not been able to arrange this so far in the ordinary way owing to the financial pressure upon our General Fund, but I am writing to let you know that by a special arrangement we are now hoping to pay the small annual sum of £25 as a contribution from C.M.S. through an anonymous donor. The fact that this contribution comes from an anonymous donor and not out of the Society's General Fund means that it is dependent upon the life of the donor, and if the donor should die, or meet with unexpected financial losses, the contribution would come to an end. I feel it is only right to mention this last fact so that the Board of Governors may not consider that they have an absolute right to count on the continuance of the contribution.

I am afraid the size of the contribution is all too small, but the Archbishop of Sydney (Dr. Mowll) gave us to understand that even a small contribution would be welcome so that C.M.S. might be reckoned as one of the contributing Boards. We know well how many favours C.M.S. has received from the Women's College in past years, and we are glad to feel now that we may have this status of a contributing Board rather than one who accepts the favours of the College entirely of grace.





My dear Mr. Steeles

Let me acknowledge with thanks receipt of your letter of December 7th, with its enclosed draft for US\$543.25 including US\$123.25 (L25) for the Women's College and US\$420 toward your Society's contribution to the 1934 budget of the University.

I am sorry that we have failed to communicate with you with regard to this year's appropriation from the Church Missionary Society since you have obviously been expecting a letter from us. Since our bydget for this year was adopted at the Board of Governors' meeting in Oxford on June 25th and 26th with Mr. Barclay present and since the details of the budget are found on page ten of the minutes of that meeting, a copy of which was sent to Mr. Barclay and to the other representatives of your Society on the Board of Governors, I have assumed that the various officers in your Society have been kept informed of our discussions and actions.

There is one point at which your remittance for this year does not seem to be in accordance with our budget estimates. For a number of years the Church Missionary Society has been contributing the sum of 100 toward the West China budget. While we appreciate the fact that our supporting mission boards from both sides of the Atlantic have been compelled by declining income to scale down practically all of their appropriations, we have hoped that this contribution of 1100, being quite a modest one in comparison with what the other supporting boards are contributing, would be considered a minimum figure. Two years ago when the United States dollar had a very high value in comparison with British and Canadian currency, our West China Governors took action that our British and Canadian friends should be asked to contribute only the amounts in their own curriences they had previously been giving even though this resulted in a substantial deficit in our budget estimates. This year, when the exchange is much more favorable to British and Canadian curriencies we are hoping that our British and Canadian friends will be able to continue to give the same amounts in their own curriencies, rather than shifting toward smaller figures in United States currency which their contributions yielded last year and the year before. That is to say, we hope that the Church Missionary Society can again send us the full 1100

which at current rates of exchange would be slightly less than US\$500, rather than only the US\$420 which your contribution yielded a year ago. Even this amount will give a slightly smaller total than the US\$650 which we estimated in June would probably be available from your total contributions of \$125, but this small shrinkage due to fluctuations of exchange should probably be borne by the University.

I have to thank you for your letter of the 26th.

my name was included on the Committee for Propaganda on behalf of
the West China Union University. To tell the truth this puts
me in a rather awkward position. I am Secretary of the Church
Missionary Society, which has countless other projects on not
dissimilar to the W.C.U.U. all over the world, and my special
duty is the care of our Missions in China and Japan, where I have
to give of my best to all the work in our six Far Eastern Missions,
irrespective of any that I might wish to choose out by preference.
You will realise, therefore, that it would be hardly fair to the
rest of the work if I were to go out of my way to try to secure
funds for just one branch of the whole without considering the
equally great needs of other portions of our work.

It is already known to you that we have in England a committee for furthering the aims of the Christian Universities in China.

Mr. Sewell, formerly on the staff of the W.C.U.U., and now once again at work in Chengtu, was the Secretary of this Committee for several years. He and his successors have done their utmost to stir up interest and to find supporters for the China Universities. So far little tangible success has attended their efforts, though we all hope that the improved economic position in England may gradually produce improved results. I cannot, however, help feeling that it is unlikely that what Mr. Sewell failed to accomplish while giving his whole time to the work, is likely to be effected by any sporadic efforts on my part, or those of any well-wisher of the University.

In addition to all this, the whole of England is being combed through by a very efficient organisation to secure funds for the Christian Colleges in India. Although it is clear that English people are more likely to give to work within the British Empire, yet their efforts have been attended with only limited success.

My dear Mr. Barclay:

I have your letter of June 8th. In this you state that you recently heard from West China Union University that the Women's College has not been profiting by any larger sum handed over by the Board of Governors than that which it received before the Church Missionary Society made its special contribution of £25 per annum. This surprises us greatly, for I thought we were handling the matter in as clear-cut a way as possible.

From the time this contribution was first made, we have been keeping the Bursar's office informed that this is a special gift designated for the work of the Women's College. In all of our budget analyses and reports we have set this 25 apart as a specially designated gift.

I presume that the essential difficulty lies in the fact that the income from western sources for West China Union University has decreased so during the last few years that the amount available for every department of the University is much less now than it was a few years ago. It is quite true, of course, that the Women's Colleges does not receive any more from the Governors now than it did before this grant of £ 25 was made. But, on the other hand if this grant had not been made the Women's College would probably have received just 25 less than it is now getting. Each of the three North American Women's Missionary Societies have been compelled to reduce their appropriations quite substantially. While the Board of Governors has thus far succeeded in keeping its appropriation to the current budget up to the minimum of LC\$50,000 which it promised the Board of Directors it would try to provide, this has been possible only by our including within the \$50,000 all of the funds applicable to any department of the University's work. Even so, the Governors have for several years not received enough in income to cover this \$50,000 appropriation, and have had to dip each year into a small reserve fund which we built up in more prosperous times.

We are having a meeting of the West China Executive Committee in Toronto on June 22nd. Chancellor Beech will be present. I will present your letter, and will suggest that the Committee take whatever steps may be necessary to insure that the designation of this 25 is made so clear that there can be no misunderstanding on the field as to its use. Under separate cover we have sent you a copy of the minutes of the June 22nd meeting of the West China Executive Committee. You will note action taken under minute E-1223 with regard to the special gift of \$25 per annum designated as a gift for the Women's College.

The West China Governors are always anxious to administer every special gift in exact accordance with the wishes of the donor, and accordingly the Committee instructed that we forward this 50 as a special payment, over and above the regular budget obligations of the Governors, to the Bursar of the University. A draft for this amount is now being purchased and will be forwarded in the next mail.

No doubt Dr. Anderson will write you as Secretary of the Executive Committee, calling attention to the larger questions of policy raised by the resolutions which the Committee adopted in this connection.

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

February 24, 1937 Miss Edith Baring-Gould Church Missionary Society 2 Salisbury Square London, E.C.4, England HOEXED My dear Miss Baring-Gould: Dr. Anderson has just passed along to me your inquiry as to how the Church Missionary Society should remit the L.C.\$450. which you have generously undertaken to provide toward the budget of the West China Union Theological College during the fiscal year 1937-38. As yet the West China Governors and the administrative officers in charge of the theological school have not discussed the particular question of whether the treasurer of the Board of Governors should receive these contributions from the supporting mission boards and transmit them to the field, or whether these contributions should be transmitted direct to Chengtu by the mission boards themselves. Since the amounts requested are in local currency figures, a little care will have to be taken that remittances are handled in such a way as to avoid the complications of gain or loss from fluctuations in exchange. These are matters which will be discussed in fuller detail at the Annual Meeting of the West China Governors on May 12th. Inasmuch as these appropriations will not be needed in Chengtu until after the beginning of the new fiscal year on July 1, 1937, it seems to me that the question of just how and when these appropriations are to be paid can safely be deferred until after the West China Governors meet on May 12th. 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

I believe that you indicated at that time that the Church Missionary Society would be willing either to remit the funds direct to Chengtu through your usual channels, or else to transmit them through the New York Office of the West China Board of Governors. I promised to let you know the procedure which the West China Board of Governors favors. The West China Governors have now indicated their willingness to have the cooperating Missionary Societies transmit their appropriations for the Union Theological School in either way that the individual Boards prefer-Where the Boards have no special preference, the Governors suggest that the funds be transmitted through the office of the Treasurer of the Board of Governors since that is the channel now being followed by the Boards for their other appropriations to the University. If the Church Missionary Society elects to transmit through our New York office your appropriation of LC\$450 for the year 1937-38, your simplest procedure would probably be to send us a draft in United States dollars for the approximate equivalent of LC\$450, at current rates of exchange. Our office will purchase a draft on Chengtu for exactly \$450 and will report to you any variation , in exchange rates so that an adjustment between our two offices can be made. If you prefer, our office would be glad to purchase the draft for LC\$450 and transmit it to Chengtu before you make your remittance, notifying you as to the exact cost so you could transmit that amount without the necessity for any later adjustment. Dear Dr. Garside,

West China Union University. - Thank you for your letter of June 18th, enclosing the questionnaire on the subject of missionary personnel for us to fill in. This has arrived just as the whole question of our responsibility to the University has of necessity come up before our Committee on the strength of the Report that I have written after my recent tour.

The Committee find themselves faced with big educational responsibilities in several parts of China other than the West China Union University, and feel that, compared with what we are doing in other places, we are, at the present time, doing a full share, if not more than a full share, for the W.C.U.U. We have of course a very deep interest in the Institution, and that, I think, is proved by the way in which we have greatly added to our missionary staff there, while many other Societies have had to reduce their staffs. Our Committee felt bound to decide that under the present circumstances they were unable to consider any fulca increase in our present staff.

They again considered the question of an increase in grant to the University, as requested by the Board of Governors, so as to bring up the contribution of the English unit to G\$4000. For similar reasons to those given in the case of staff, they felt unable at the present time to make any addition to our grant.

I hope that the Board of Governors will not feel that we are weakening in our interest in the work of the University, but I can assure you that the result of my visit round China was to

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



Chengtu Union Middle School. - When I was up in West China I attended a meeting of the Committee of the Union Middle School, at which the suggestion was put out that in order to make certain that the grants for the different Missions would be received by the School, they should in future be paid through the Board of Governors in New York. Further, while I was still in the Far East, our Committee here expressed a willingness to concur in this procedure. We have however heard nothing as to whether the other Missions are falling in with this suggestion, and so we have taken no action to pay our grant this year through the Board of Directors. 





Dear Dr. Garside,

Thank you for your letter of December 2nd. I am surprised to hear that you have, so far, not heard the suggestion that the Union Middle School in connexion with the W.C.U.U. should receive its grants from the supporting Missions through the Board of Governors of the University. If I understood correctly, the Committee of the Union Middle School in Chengtu felt that there was no other way to make sure of receiving their grants, for some of the field Committees of the supporting Missions, finding their appropriations from home drastically cut down, have ceased to pay their contributions to the Union Middle School, or, at any rate, reduced the amount that they promised. The carrying on of the Union Middle School had therefore become a very serious problem, and it was felt that if the Mission Boards would undertake to pay their contribution through the Board of Governors of the University in New York, and, to that extent, cut down their appropriations to the Missions on the field, then the Union Middle School could go forward on an assured income, which would make the running of the School very much more satisfactory than it has been in the past. I do not know why the request has never come through from West China.

Under the circumstances I do not quite see what the Board of Governors can do in the matter, though it may possibly be that they may like to hear of the suggestion, and make enquiries in Chengtu as to whether the Union Middle School is at present being supplied with the funds by the local missions as was arranged at the time when the University took responsibility for the running of the School.
