English Baftist Correspondence 1935-1936 Miss Marjorie Robertson c/o Associated Missions Treasurers Post Office Box 251 Shanghai, China



My dear Miss Robertson:

We trust that when this letter reaches you, you will be safely arrived in Shanghai after a very pleasant voyage from England.

We have been in correspondence and consultation with the Woman's American Baptist Foreign Missionary Society with regard to their including you among their representatives at West China Union University. The Society is very cordal to the suggestion, although they have to give the matter rather careful study because they have a regulation to the effect that they cannot appoint anyone whom the secretaries of the Society have not seen as one of the regular missionaries of the Society. I hope the Society can find some way to meet this regulation, either by accepting the testimony of Mr. C. E. Wilson and others of the English Baptist Missionary Society, or, if necessary, by getting endorsements from the representatives of the W.A.B.F.M.S. in China.

Meantime, it is important that we see to it that funds are provided for you. I am enclosing herewith a draft fro \$502.10 Shanghai dollars which is the equi-v valent at today's rate of exchange of US\$150. The Baptist Woman's Board rate of salary for a signle woman in China is US\$75 per month, so this enclosed draft will take care of your salary for two months. From the letter Mr. Silcock wrote you on November 26th, a copy of which he sent me, I understand that the funds provided you when you left England were adequate to cover your expenses until you arrive in Shanghai together with your travel up-river to Chengtu, and that according to the usual custom of the British Board your salary would begin from the date you arrive in Shanghai. If I am correct in my understanding this enclosed draft would cover your salary from January 8th to March 7th inclusive. Please let me know frankly, however, if this is not an equitable arrangement, and we will be happy to make any necessary adjustment.

I hope that before we get to the close of March 7th, some definite arrangement with the Baptist Woman's Board will have been made, and that they will be in a position to begin paying your salary from that point on. But if final decisions are delayed, we will write you again in February, continuing your salary payments from month to month until more definite arrangements have been made.

We have, of course, sent the field the good news that you are on you r way to China, and no doubt Mr. Silcock has written also. I hope that you will find all arrangements made at the University to give you a hearty and cordial reception. I know they will be very happy to have you madertakeximmediately. on the campus and that there will be many important tasks which you can undertake immediately. I am enclosing herewith another letter taking up some of the definite ways in which you can render a valuable service to tying more closely together the University itself and the offices in New York and London.

My dear Mr. Ewings

Miss Marjorie Robertson has informed us that before she sailed for West China you kindly offered to act as her banker in England to facilitate payment of her insurance premiums. She asked that our West China office here in New York or whatever Board may ultimately handle her salary arrangements, make periodic remittances to you to cover these premiums.

The instructions given to us by Miss Robertson are as follows:-

"Will you, or the Board which pays my salary kindly deduct each month, (commencing in April 1936) the equivalent of thirty shillings (or the nearest number of dollars to such equivalent) and pay this money over quarterly to Mr. Ewing for my account at the B.M.S".

If we understand Miss Robertson correctly, she desires that we remit to you in an amount equal to minety shillings each quarter. Is this in accordance with your understanding? Shall we send you the first draft for ninety shillings in April 1936? We will be glad to purchase drafts on London for whatever amount is requested.

We are still consulting with several of the mission boards cooperating in Nest China concerning the possibility of their adopting Miss Robertson as an affiliated member of their staff at the University. It is possible, therefore, that when these arrangements are completed such remittances may be made by one of the mission boards rather than by our office here in New York. Meantime, however, we must see to it that such funds are remitted to you to cover the payments you should make on Miss Robertson's behalf.


