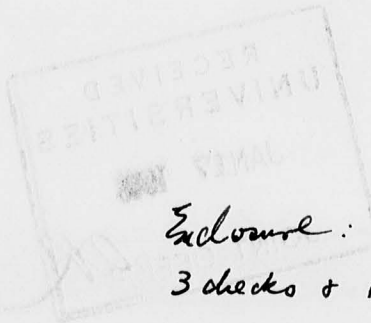


I hope you find the answer satisfactory, for we don't want to get the Associated Boards into trouble with the United China Relief.

Dear Mrs. Ku:

You have done very well in clearing with the Boston Committee and we congratulate you. As long as you carry on in the manner which you have indicated, by the selling of tickets, and as the Boston Committee has approved, there is nothing to hinder you from that score.

Pictures which we have listed are available any time you may designate as none of them are spoken for in the immediate future. We should know as soon as possible, however.

I am sorry that we do not have anything about Chengtu. Many pictures have been taken and we have small negatives of a great variety of interests, but none are good enough to warrant our investing the money in making slides of them. Two things make it extremely difficult; one is the securing of photographic film and the other the local weather conditions in Chengtu.

In checking on the possibility of sending you the moving picture machine and screen, we are advised against doing so at this time because of existing conditions in transportation. One of our young ladies coming down from Boston lost a valuable parcel, and that is a common occurrence. Shipping facilities are overcrowded and valuable parcels often left in the open, and if destroyed by the weather there is no recourse as the company takes refuge in the "act of God" phrase in the shipping indenture.

The cost of transportation back and forth also is a very considerable item, and you probably could rent equipment in Boston for much less than the transportation charges from New York. There are firms which make a business of renting equipment and I would suggest that you get in touch with some of them.

I must admit there is not much of an appeal in showing the old pictures of Yenching at Peking. You will have to decide whether or not



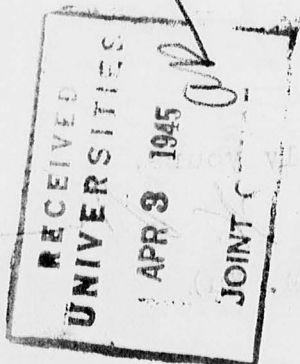

Enclosed also is a list of persons who wish to have formal receipts.


