A Letter from the Acting-President

December 22, 1947

Dear Yenching Alumni:

I write this letter because we wish you to be informed about Yenching; you should know about our problems and difficulties. We want you to know about our plans.

Enrollment. Yenching now has about 900 students. We do not plan to receive more than this number, because we desire quality rather than quantity, and because we believe in intimate contacts between faculty and students. The ratio of teachers to students is 1:9.8. Journalism is the largest department. This year's freshman class of 250 was carefully selected from almost 3,000 applicants; I believe this class will be a credit to Yenching.

Finances. The annual income from both China and abroad last year was about US\$300,000. This was expended as follows:

General Administration	15%
Instruction	41%
Library	6%
Buildings and Grounds (including heat	34%
and other services)	
Scholarships	4%

Our actual costs on a U.S.-dollar basis are four or five times greater than before the war, but our academic program is practically the same as before the war. We face a serious deficit this year, but every effort will be made to reduce expenses. A six weeks recess in winter will save coal.

Cost per Student. From the above figures you can calculate that the cost per student is about US\$350. Each student pays fees equal to about one-fifteenth of this. (per year).

Scholarships and Student Aid. Many students are not able to pay the tuition fees. We need more scholarship funds for worthy students with high scholastic grades. We also need relief funds to help needy students purchase more nutritious food. About 400 students now receive financial aid.

Postwar Academic Aims. Yenching has played an important role in higher education in China; we have a widening responsibility. We must adapt our curriculum to postwar needs. We believe in high standards. We should not duplicate the work of other universities, but we should develop intensively a few subjects of study and do these well. The faculty are now studying this problem and important changes may result.

Industrial Training Program. A new part of Yenching is the Industrial Training Program, carried on by our departments of chemistry and physics. Courses in industrial chemistry and in general engineering are offered. Friends of Yenching among the industrialists and manufacturers in Tientsin and Shanghai are contributing the funds. The 5-year course of study will include both laboratory and classroom instruction and also practical work in factories. Buildings erected by the Japanese on the campus during the war are being reconstructed for this work.



Rehabilitation. Our telephone service is being partially restored; roofs of the main buildings were repaired last summer; the main gate is newly painted. But it will take several more years before the rehabilitation is complete. We cannot yet supply hot water to the dormitories; many repairs are needed; there are no campus lights; the power plant needs new boilers.

Faculty Furloughs. This is so important that, in spite of difficult finances, we are resuming the furlough arrangement which was interrupted before the war. Our faculty must have the opportunity to keep up-to-date.

Yenching. For American Students. More American students are applying for entrance to A special course of study on Chinese culture in English is being organized.

Faculty Publications. This is an important university activity. The List of Publications shows a total of 50 journal contributions or books written by our faculty last year. The "Yenching Journal of Chinese Studies" has already resumed publication. It is hoped to revive the "Yenching Journal of Social Studies". Printed news letters from the various departments are beginning to reappear.

Child Welfare Training Program. This course of study was started a year ago; special funds were provided. It includes practical work; nursery school, health clinic, and courses in sociology, home economics, education.

Cooperation with Tsinghua. Some suggest that Tsinghua and Yenching should cooperate more closely. Last year a number of Tsinghua-Yenching seminars were jointly organized. This year we have actually begun on a small scale an exchange of students. This avoids duplicating some courses.

Distinguished Visitors. The list of visitors on the campus during the last few months includes such names as: H.H. Kung, Chang Chun, Chu Chia-hua, Han Li-wu, John D. Rockefeller 3rd, William C. A Letter from the Acting-President

June 10. 1948

Dear Yenching Alumni:

I write again to share with you our plans and our problems. We are optimistic for next year and the future.

Alumni Day. Our annual Home-Coming was held on April 24th. About 300 alumni gathered from Tientsin and Peiping. The buildings were open for inspection; a number of interesting exhibits were arranged, including the new micro-film equipment in the library. The Acting-President addressed the alumni at the luncheon; informal gatherings were held in the afternoon, followed by an evening program in Bashford Auditorium. We were encouraged by the many expressions of loyalty and the intense interest shown by all in the university's welfare.

Curriculum Changes. After careful restudy of the undergraduate curriculum, the faculty is planning for next year two new programs of study, one in Chinese Culture and another in Western Culture. This new type of study-program, it is hoped, will ultimately replace the present rather restricted and highly specialized departmental requirements. Students who have completed the freshman year in the College of Arts and Letters will next year have the privilege of selecting one of these new study-programs. Details of the new plan will be published and circulated as soon as possible. In addition to this, the faculty favor tutorial methods of instruction and small classes.

English Language Institute. With the aid of the United States Educational Foundation for China, an English Language Institute will be established at Yenching next fall. This Institute will offer opportunities for research and advanced study in linguistics and the teaching of languages. It will arrange for extension courses and the preparation of textbooks for middle schools and colleges. New faculty from China and abroad will be invited to conduct the Institute program. Yenching was selected as the location for this Institute, because of our achievements in English language teaching.

Wellesley-Yenching Cooperation. Wellesley alumnae in the United States are raising funds to aid our Department of Western Languages. This will make possible more adequate work in the field of comparative literature.

Wellesley-Yenching Exchange. Beginning with September 1948, Wellesley College will send to Yenching each year a graduate student assistant, who will represent Wellesley on the Yenching campus. Yenching University will reciprocate by sending a graduate student assistant to Wellesley College. During 1948-49 Wellesley will be represented on the Yenching campus by an assistant in the Department of Chemistry.

Visiting Professors. Next year we will have with us an unusual number of visiting professors from abroad. Their coming will make possible special courses in economics, sociology, English literature, philosophy.

Financial Income. The subject of financial support is causing us considerable anxiety. You will remember that a large amount of our current funds come from abroad. Recently, however, contributions from donors in America have decreased, and the prospect for next year is discouraging. Our regular program may need to be still further reduced. Research work has already been curtailed. Subjects of study which are not absolutely essential to the basic undergraduate program are being suspended.

June 10, 1948

Faculty Salaries. The funds saved by retrenchment in other parts of the budget are being used to maintain faculty salaries at a proper level. We propose to continue this policy. Our desire is to retain on the faculty our most experienced and effective teachers.

Physical Education and Athletics. The Annual Field Day on May 8th was a tremendous success. Students in increasing numbers are participating in intra-mural sports. The General Championship Cup this year was won by the College of Natural Science. The Good Sportsmanship Cup was awarded to the College of Arts and Letters. The fine spirit of healthy competition which these occasions develop has permanent educational value.

Extra-Curriculum Lectures. A schedule of special lectures has continued on a bi-weekly basis throughout the academic year. Distinguished scholars have come to Yenching from China and abroad.

University Assemblies. These all-university gatherings have been held this year every three or four weeks. Recent programs included an oratorical contest in English, and an instructive talk on musical themes and techniques. Honors Day, when scholarship awards for the year were formally announced, was held on June 3rd.

Student Health. This is an important problem. The University Health Service has been alert; we are glad to state that tuberculosis and other health conditions related to poor nutrition are not on the increase. During the present year special relief funds enabled us to supply an extra ration of eggs, milk and meat to certain selected students. More recently the China Relief Mission has granted funds to effect more general improvement in the food served in the university dining halls.

Alumni Contributions: Scholarships and Student Aid. We are happy to acknowledge the following alumni gifts:

These funds are being used for scholarships and grants to students, who are in need. More than half of all Yenching students are now receiving financial assistance of some sort.

Student Unrest. The political situation has caused repercussions among university students, and our campus has shared in the general unrest. During the middle of the semester we lost a week and a half of classwork. All of us, students and staff, feel that the strike as a means of expressing student sentiment, is out-of-date; and at Yenching we are trying to work out some device which will take its place. One of the accepted Yenching traditions is that all classwork lost on account of student strikes shall be made up.

Campus Rehabilitation. Tremendous progress has been made in beautifying the campus. Trees have been trimmed and bushes replanted. New boilers are soon to be installed in the power plant. Student cooperation is being enlisted on campus projects; a "thrift campaign" is being launched; one of its objects is to economize on electric lights.

Visitors. Among recent visitors have been Miss Mary Sweeny of the Merrill-Palmer School, Miss Ava B. Milam, Dean of Home Economics at Oregon State College, and Dr. C. B. Fahs of the Rockefeller Foundation. Dr. Y. T. Tsur and Mr. S. J. Chuan, members of the Board of Managers, have also paid visits to the campus.

Faculty Notes. British Council Fellowships for study in England have been awarded to Professor Tu Lien-yueh (physics) and Professor Liao Tai-chu (education). Dr. T. C. Chao has been awarded the Press Literature Prize for 1947, in recognition of his book "An Interpretation of Christianity".

Commencement. On June 29th, we will grant A.B. and B.S. degrees to a senior class of about 115. The commencement address will be delivered by the American Ambassador.

President's Office. My term of office as Acting-President comes to a close this month and I look forward to returning to laboratory work. I have appreciated the privilege of working closely with a loyal faculty and staff and being associated with so many loyal alumni.

Dear Fellow Alumnus:

The following is a letter from Dr. Wm. H. Adolph which is self-explanatory:

"TO THE YENCHING ALUMNI IN USA:

Dear Friends,

We were greatly encouraged to know that you were making a special financial effort in behalf of students at Menching, who were in financial distress. And now let me acknowledge receipt of a total of US\$466 which you have remitted to us.

It is a source of much encouragement to us here to know that we can count on your loyalty, when Yenching faces difficulties. Chinese Art Objects Belong in the Peiping Palace Museum

EXTENSION OF REMARKS OF

HON. GEORGE G. SADOWSKI

OF MICHIGAN

IN THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES Tuesday, March 1, 1949

Mr. SADOWSKI. Mr. Speaker, this morning I received a letter signed by various Chinese students and alumni associations protesting against the proposed shipping of priceless Chinese art objects to this country. I saw the United Press dispatch several days ago stating that the Nationalist Government proposed to send this priceless collection to the United States.

I do not think that we should become a party to this deal. This art collection represents Chinese culture over the centuries and belongs to the Chinese people and not to any group of Chinese politicians.

At this point I wish to include the letter which I received:

Dear Sir: A United Press dispatch from Shanghai on January 28, 1949, reported that a collection of 8,600 priceless Chinese art objects from the Peiping Palace Museum are being shipped to this country and to be housed at the Library of Congress. Shocked by this news, we hasten to point out the consequences which this shipment will engender.

The national art treasures of China have been pilfered many times. The warlords used to trade them for material support from foreign powers. When Japan invaded China, many of these treasures were taken as war booty and shipped to Japan. Each time, such pillage has caused deep resentment in the Chinese people.

We do not know whether the United States has sponsored the present shipment. We

has sponsored the present shipment. We loathe to think so. But in any case, it will be resented by the Chinese people just the same. For the sake of the traditional friendship between China and the United States. we sincerely hope that you will see to it that these art treasures of China are not shipped to this country.

We are aware of the vigilance with which you safeguard your national treasures. We think that it is within reason for us to ask you to respect the vigilance with which we safeguard our national treasures.
