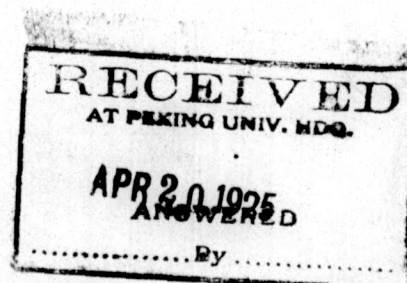

Dear Leighton:

I have at length received a reply from Mr. Liebold, Secretary to Henry Ford. He telegraphs as follows:

"Can see Philip Fu Monday March tenth."

Philip already knows that I stated in the letter signed by him and mailed to Mr. Liebold just before Philip left for California, that he would take the liberty of bringing with him Dr. J. Leighton Stuart, American Adviser to a group of Chinese bankers, whom Philip Fu represents. It is my understanding that no mention of Yenching University will be made, though you will naturally be able to sense the situation and decide what is the proper thing to do.

I feel much encouraged with reference to the Princeton endowment drive. Merle-Smith is giving himself still further trouble to see that we get absolutely maximum value out of the Princeton endorsement. He is now going over the material for our booklet to suggest to me certain slight modifications which will place this statement before the alumni in such a way as to give them the impression that a prominent group of Princeton men are undertaking to finance this school in China as a laboratory for the use of the Princeton School of Public and International Affairs. The idea is first-rate and I have heartily endorsed it, even though it causes a little delay in getting the Princeton booklet to the press.

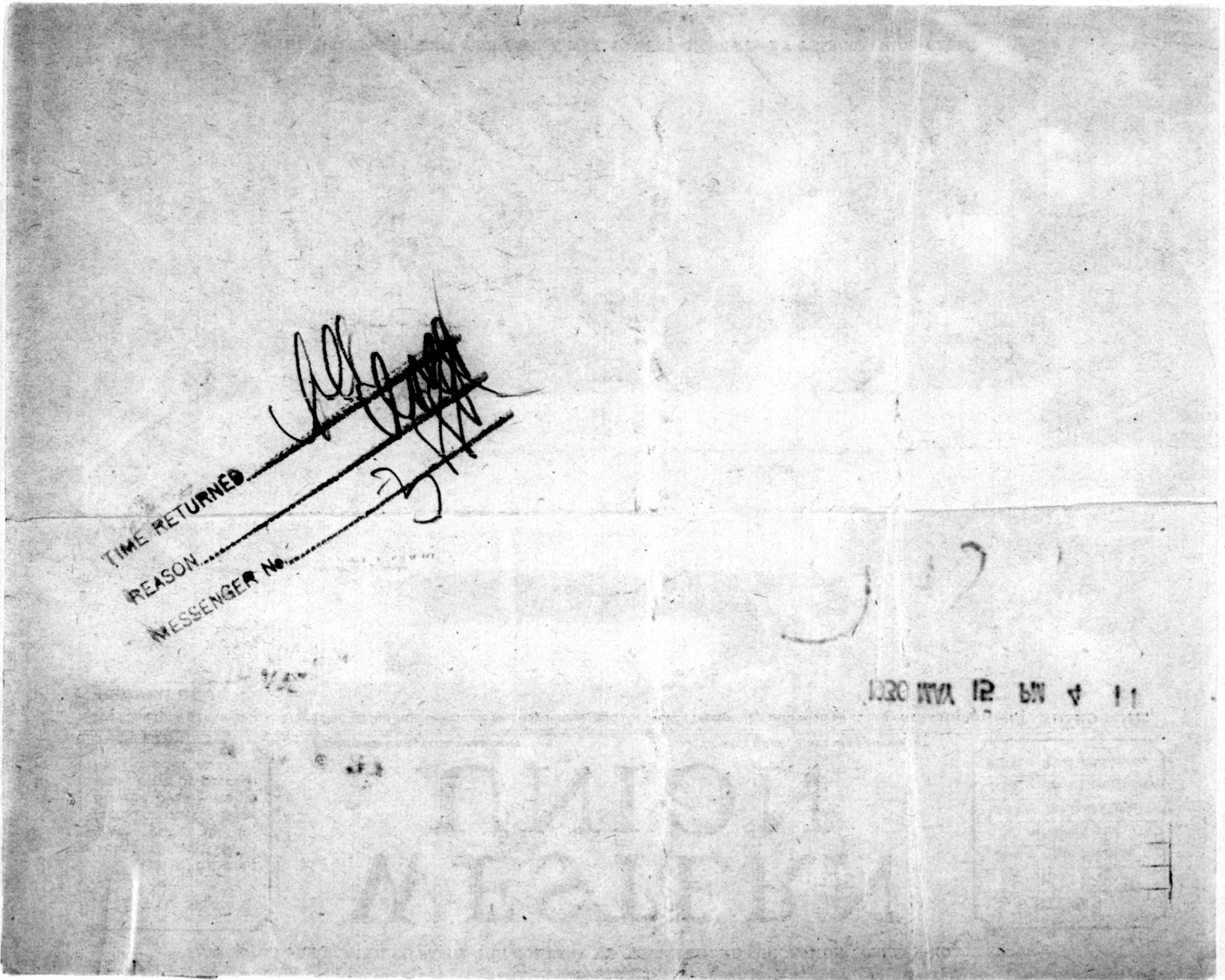
